12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:		
13			
14	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of [sections 1 through 8 9 4], the following		
15	definitions apply:		
16	(1) "Capital project" means the acquisition of land or improvements or the planning, capital construction,		
17	renovation, equipping, furnishing, <del>or</del> major repair projects <del>authorized in [sections 2 through 8 <u>9</u>]., OR PROJECTS</del>		
18	TO IMPLEMENT TRIBAL COMPACTS.		
19	(2) "Other funding sources" means money other than capital projects fund money, state special revenue		
20	fund money, or general fund money that accrues to an agency under the provisions of the law. Other funding		
21	sources may include auxiliary fund, donations, grants, and higher education funds.

23	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriations. The following money is appropriated to the department		
24	of administration NATURAL RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION from the capital projects account from the proceeds		
25	of the bonds authorized by [section 4 3] for the indicated capital projects:		
26	(1) Montana state university-Bozeman, Romney Hall classroom renovation, \$20 million;		
27	(2) Montana state university-Billings, science and instructional tech building addition, \$10 million;

11	<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3	. Authorizations of other funding sources. The department of
12	administration is authorized to expend	money for the indicated capital projects from other funding sources as
13	follows:

29	NEW SECTION. Section 3.	Authorization for bonds conditions. (1) The board of examiners is
30	authorized to issue and sell general obl	gation bonds in an amount not exceeding <del>\$87.9 <u>\$75.5</u> \$17</del> million for the

capital projects described in [section 2] in addition to the amount of general obligation bonds outstanding on
 January 1, 2013.

3 (2) The bonds in this section must be issued in accordance with the terms and in the manner required
4 by Title 17, chapter 5, part 8. The authority granted to the board of examiners by this section is in addition to any
5 other authorization to the board of examiners to issue and sell general obligation bonds.

6 (3) The proceeds from the bonds sold under this section must be deposited in the capital projects7 account provided for in 17-5-804.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Planning and design. The department of administration may proceed with
 the planning and design of capital projects prior to the receipt of the other funding sources. The entities receiving
 funds pursuant to [sections 1 through 8 <u>9</u>] may use interentity loans in accordance with 17-2-107 to pay planning
 and design costs incurred before the receipt of the funding sources in [sections 2 and 3].

14 NEW SECTION. Section 6. Agreement with department of environmental quality. The department 15 of environmental quality shall review capital projects authorized in [section 2] for potential inclusion in the state 16 building energy conservation program. When a review shows that a capital project will result in energy 17 improvements, that capital project must be submitted to the energy conservation program for consideration of 18 receiving funding under that program. Funding provided under the energy conservation program guidelines must 19 be used to offset or add to the authorized funding for the capital project, and the amount must be dependent on 20 the annual utility savings resulting from the facility improvement. Agencies must be notified of potential funding 21 after the review.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 7. Capital projects -- contingent funds. If a capital project is financed in
 whole or in part with funding from other funding sources, the department of administration may not let the projects
 for bid until the agency has submitted a financial plan for approval by the director of the department. A financial
 plan may not be approved by the director if:

(1) the level of funding provided under the financial plan deviates substantially from the funding level
 provided in [section 3] for that project; or

(2) the scope of the capital project is substantially altered or revised from the capital project presented
 to the 63rd legislature.

2	NEW SECTION. Section 8. Conditions of projects. The legislature authorizes construction of
3	THE BUTTE-SILVER BOW EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER, TO BE OCCUPIED AND OPERATED BY THE CONSOLIDATED
4	GOVERNMENT OF BUTTE-SILVER BOW IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE BUTTE JUSTICE CENTER, IF A LONG-TERM LEASE
5	AGREEMENT IS SIGNED BETWEEN THE STATE OF MONTANA AND THE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT OF BUTTE-SILVER BOW
6	ENSURING PAYMENT OF ALL OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE COSTS OF THE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT OF
7	BUTTE-SILVER BOW FOR ITS PORTION OF THE FACILITY FOR THE LIFE OF THE BUILDING, UNTIL THE TERM OF THE LEASE
8	IS ALTERED, OR UNTIL THE BUILDING IS SOLD.

10	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Legislative consent. The appropriations authorized in [sections 2 and 3]
11	[SECTION 2] constitute legislative consent for the capital projects contained in [sections 2 and 3] [SECTION 2] within
12	the meaning of 18-2-102.
13	
14	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Coordination. If the Excluding the capital projects to implement tribal
15	COMPACTS, IF THE UNASSIGNED AND UNENCUMBERED AUDITED ENDING FUND BALANCE OF THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE
16	FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2013, AS PROVIDED BY THE STATE ACCOUNTANT DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION,
17	ACCOUNTING DIVISION, IN THE COMPREHENSIVE ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT EXCEEDS $\$150$ \$466 MILLION BY MORE THAN
18	THE AMOUNT OF THE BOND AUTHORIZATION IN [SECTION 4], [SECTION 3], THERE IS AN APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL
19	FUND IN FISCAL YEAR 2014 FOR THE AMOUNT OF THE PROJECTS APPROVED IN [THIS ACT] MUST BE PAID FOR OUT OF THE
20	GENERAL FUND RATHER THAN BEING PAID WITH BOND PROCEEDS AND ALL THE BONDING AUTHORITY PROVIDED IN [THIS
21	ACT] IS VOID REDUCED TO THE AMOUNT OF THE BONDS FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS TO IMPLEMENT TRIBAL COMPACTS.

23	COORDINATION SECTION. Section 11. Coordination instruction. If House Bill No. 5 is not passed
24	AND APPROVED WITH AN APPROPRIATION TO THE MONTANA HISTORICAL SOCIETY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE
25	MONTANA HERITAGE CENTER IN HELENA, THEN [SECTION 2] IS AMENDED TO INCLUDE AN APPROPRIATION OF \$23 MILLION
26	TO THE MONTANA HISTORICAL SOCIETY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE MONTANA HERITAGE CENTER AND THE AMOUNT
27	OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS AUTHORIZED TO BE ISSUED PURSUANT TO [SECTION 4] IS INCREASED BY \$23 MILLION.
28	
29	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Two-thirds vote required. Because [section 4 3] authorizes the creation
30	of state debt, Article VIII, section 8, of the Montana constitution requires a vote of two-thirds of the members of
