12	"2-15-3308. Drought and water suppl	l <u>y</u> advisory comr	nittee. (1) There is a drought <u>and water supply</u>
13	advisory committee in the department of natura	l resources and c	onservation.
14	(2) The drought and water supply advisory committee is chaired by a representative of the governor and		
15	consists of representatives of the departments of natural resources and conservation; agriculture; commerce; fish,		
16	wildlife, and parks; military affairs; environmental quality; and livestock. The governor's representative must be		
17	appointed by the governor, and the representative of each department must be appointed by the head of that		
18	department. Additional, nonvoting members who represent drought-affected federal and local government		
19	agencies and public and private interests affected by drought or flooding may also be appointed by the governor		
20	(3) The drought and water supply advis	sory committee sl	nall:
21	(a) with the approval of the governor, de-	velop and implem	ent a state drought plan <u>that considers drought</u>
22	and flooding;		
23	(b) review and report drought and water	er supply monitori	ng information to the public;
24	(c) coordinate timely drought and flood	ling impact asses	sments;
25	(d) identify areas of the state with a h	nigh probability of	drought or flooding and target reporting and
26	assistance efforts to those areas;		
27	(e) upon request, assist in organizing lo	ocal drought advi	sory committees for the areas identified under
28	subsection (3)(d);		
29	(f) request state agency staff to provide technical assistance to local drought advisory committees; and		
30	(g) promote ideas and activities for gr	roups and individ	uals to consider that may reduce drought or
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1 <u>flooding</u> vulnerability.

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- (4) The drought <u>and water supply</u> advisory committee shall meet, at a minimum, on or around October 15 and March 15 of each year to assess moisture conditions <u>and forecasts</u> and, as appropriate, begin preparations for drought <u>or flood</u> mitigation.
 - (5) By April 15 of each year, the drought <u>and water supply</u> advisory committee shall submit a report to the governor describing the potential for drought <u>or flooding</u> in the coming year. If the potential for drought <u>or flooding</u> merits additional activity by the drought <u>and water supply</u> advisory committee, the report must also describe:
- (a) activities to be taken by the drought <u>and water supply</u> advisory committee for informing the public about the potential for <u>impacts of drought or flooding</u>;
 - (b) a schedule for completing activities;
- (c) geographic areas for which the creation of local drought <u>and water supply</u> advisory committees will be suggested to local governments and citizens; and
- (d) requests for the use of any available state resources that may be necessary to prevent or minimize drought or flood impacts.
- (6) Nothing in this section is intended to remove or interfere with the duties and responsibilities of the governor or the division of disaster and emergency services for disaster coordination and emergency response, as provided in Title 10, chapter 3, part 1. The duties and responsibilities of the drought and water supply advisory committee supplement and are consistent with those of the division of disaster and emergency services for drought or flood planning, preparation, coordination, and mitigation."
