4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT INCREASING THE NUMBER OF AVAILABLE NONRESIDENT
5	HUNTING LICENSES; ESTABLISHING WILDERNESS-ONLY NONRESIDENT BIG GAME COMBINATION
6	LICENSES; AMENDING SECTIONS 87-2-505 AND 87-2-510, MCA; AND PROVIDING A DELAYED EFFECTIVE
7	DATE."

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	Section 1. Section 87-2-505, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"87-2-505. Class B-10nonresident big game combination license. (1) (a) Except as otherwise
13	provided in this chapter, a person who is not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who is 12 years of age or
14	older or who will turn 12 years old before or during the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment
15	of the fee of \$897 plus the nonresident hunting access enhancement fee in 87-2-202(3)(d) and subject to the
16	limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the fish, wildlife, and parks office, Helena,
17	Montana, to purchase a B-10 nonresident big game combination license that entitles a holder who is 12 years
18	of age or older to all the privileges of Class B, Class B-1, and Class B-7 licenses and an elk tag. This license
19	includes the nonresident conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202.
20	(b) Not Except as provided in subsection (3), not more than 17,000 20,000 Class B-10 licenses may be
21	sold in any 1 license year.
22	(c) Of the fee paid for the purchase of a Class B-10 nonresident big game combination license pursuant
23	to subsection (1)(a), 25% must be deposited in the account established in 87-1-290.
24	(d) The cost of the Class B-10 nonresident big game combination license must be adjusted annually
25	based on any change to the consumer price index from the previous year. The consumer price index to be used
26	for calculations is the consumer price index for all urban consumers (CPI-U).
27	(2) A person who is not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, who is unsuccessful in the Class B-10 big
28	game combination license drawing may pay a fee of \$25 to participate in a preference system for deer and elk
29	permits established by the commission.
30	(3) (a) In addition to the Class B-10 licenses made available in subsection (1), the department shall offer

6	(iv) Cabinet Mountains wilderness:
7	(v) Gates of the Mountains wilderness;

12	(x) Rattlesnake wilderness;

20	(d) The revenue collected pursuant to this subsection (3) must be deposited in the account established

23	Section 2. Section 87-2-510, MCA, is amended to read:
24	"87-2-510. Class B-11nonresident deer combination license. (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided
25	in this chapter, a person who is not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who is 12 years of age or older or who
26	will turn 12 years old before or during the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment of a fee of
27	\$527 plus the nonresident hunting access enhancement fee in 87-2-202(3)(d) and subject to the limitations
28	prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the fish, wildlife, and parks office, Helena, Montana, to
29	purchase a Class B-11 nonresident deer combination license that entitles a holder who is 12 years of age or older
30	to all the privileges of the Class B, Class B-1, and Class B-7 licenses. This license includes the nonresident

2	(b) Of the fee paid for the purchase of a Class B-11 nonresident deer combination license pursuant to
3	subsection (1)(a), 25% must be deposited in the account established in 87-1-290.
4	(c) The cost of the Class B-11 nonresident deer combination license must be adjusted annually based
5	on any change to the consumer price index from the previous year. The consumer price index to be used for
6	calculations is the consumer price index for all urban consumers (CPI-U).
7	(2) Not more than 4,600 9,500 unreserved Class B-11 licenses may be sold in any 1 license year.
8	(3) A person who is not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, who is unsuccessful in the Class B-11 deer
9	combination license drawing may pay a fee of \$25 to participate in a preference system for deer and elk permits
10	established by the commission."
