4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF MONTANA AN
5	AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE IV, SECTION 8, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION TO REVISE TERM LIMITS
6	FOR STATE LEGISLATORS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."
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8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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10	Section 1. Article IV, section 8, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
11	"Section 8. Limitation on terms of office. (1) The secretary of state or other authorized official shall
12	not certify a candidate's nomination or election to, or print or cause to be printed on any ballot the name of a
13	candidate for, one of the following offices if, at the end of the current term of that office, the candidate will have
14	served in that office or had he not resigned or been recalled would have served in that office:
15	(a) 8 or more years in any 16-year period as governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state
16	auditor, attorney general, or superintendent of public instruction;
17	(b) 8 or more years in any 16-year period as a state representative;
18	(c) 8 or more years in any 16-year period as a state senator;
19	(b) 16 or more years in any 24-year period as a state legislator, whether as a state representative or as
20	a state senator, or both;
21	(d)(c) 6 or more years in any 12-year period as a member of the U.S. house of representatives; and
22	(e)(d) 12 or more years in any 24-year period as a member of the U.S. senate.
23	(2) When computing time served for purposes of subsection (1), the provisions of subsection (1) do not
24	apply to time served in terms that end during or prior to January 1993.
25	(3) Nothing contained herein shall preclude an otherwise qualified candidate from being certified as
26	nominated or elected by virtue of write-in votes cast for said candidate."

28	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Two-thirds vote required. Because [section 1] is a legislative proposal
29	to amend the constitution, Article XIV, section 8, of the Montana constitution requires an affirmative roll call vote
30	of two-thirds of all the members of the legislature, whether one or more bodies, for passage.

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1 2 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. This amendment is effective upon approval by the 3 electorate. 4 5 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Submission to electorate. [This act] shall be submitted to the qualified electors of Montana at the general election to be held in November 2014 by printing on the ballot the full title of 6 [this act] and the following: 7 8 [] YES to revising term limits for state legislators. 9 [] NO to revising term limits for state legislators.
