2	INTRODUCED BY LIESER

4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA REQUIRING REQUESTING A STUDY OF OPTIONS TO PERMIT, INSPECT, AND MAINTAIN
6	SEPTIC SYSTEMS.
7	
8	WHEREAS, a properly designed, constructed, and maintained septic system can provide long-term,
9	effective treatment of household wastewater and is key to the property value of a home or business; and
10	WHEREAS, a poorly maintained septic system may malfunction and could cost thousands of dollars to
11	repair or replace in addition to contaminating drinking water; and
12	WHEREAS, numerous studies show that septic leachate is transported by either surface or ground water
13	flow through lake-bottom sediments into lake water, elevating nutrient concentrations; and
14	WHEREAS, a recent study by the Whitefish Lake Institute confirmed three areas on Whitefish Lake with
15	septic leachate contaminations as well as areas of low, medium, and high potential for future contamination; and
16	WHEREAS, it is unclear the extent to which counties may regulate permitting, inspection, and
17	maintenance of individual septic systems.

19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
20	STATE OF MONTANA:
21	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee, pursuant to
22	section 5-5-217, MCA, or direct sufficient staff resources to:
23	(1) evaluate current state and local regulations for permitting, inspecting, and maintaining septic systems
24	and compare those regulations to other states; and
25	(2) examine statewide and local options, including those not related to government regulation, that would
26	ensure timely and economical permitting, inspection, and maintenance of septic systems.
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the study is assigned to staff, any findings or conclusions be
28	presented to and reviewed by an appropriate committee designated by the Legislative Council.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review
30	requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2014.

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions,

2 comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee, be reported to the 64th Legislature.
