2	INTRODUCED BY L. RANDALL

4	A RESOLUTION OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA PROVIDING
5	RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE LEGISLATIVE REDISTRICTING PLAN TO THE MONTANA DISTRICTING AND
6	APPORTIONMENT COMMISSION.

8	WHEREAS, the Montana Districting and Apportionment Commission submitted its legislative redistricting
9	plan to the Legislature on January 8, 2013, as required by Article V, section 14, of the Montana Constitution; and
10	WHEREAS, the Commission adopted criteria to guide the drawing of district lines that preserve the
11	principle of "one person, one vote"; and
12	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives commends the Commission for establishing a maximum 3%
13	population deviation, which surpasses the standard of a 5% population deviation; and
14	WHEREAS, the Commission formed districts that successfully comply with all requirements of the federa
15	Voting Rights Act and that protect the voting rights of minority populations; and
16	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives contends that criteria directing the creation of compact and
17	contiguous districts that preserve communities of interest and, when possible, follow the lines of political and
18	geographic boundaries have not been satisfactorily adhered to; and
19	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives contends that the proposed plan does not pass a genera
20	appearance test regarding compactness in numerous instances, particularly House Districts 24 and 25 23 AND
21	24 in Cascade County, House Districts 47, 48, 49, and 50 in Yellowstone County, House District 66 in Gallatin
22	County, House District 81 in Lewis and Clark County, and House District 96 in Missoula County; and
23	WHEREAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONTENDS THAT THE PROPOSED PLAN DOES NOT ADEQUATELY
24	CONSIDER THE FUNCTIONAL COMPACTNESS OF DISTRICTS AS REQUIRED IN THE COMMISSION'S CRITERIA; IN PARTICULAR
25	House District 13 includes a portion of Flathead County containing Kila and Marion that is not accessible
26	BY VEHICLE FROM THE MAIN WESTERN SANDERS COUNTY PORTION OF THE DISTRICT WITHOUT HAVING TO LEAVE THE
27	DISTRICT AND ITS RESIDENTS SHARE LITTLE IN COMMON WITH SANDERS COUNTY RESIDENTS; AND
28	WHEREAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONTENDS THAT THE PROPOSED PLAN FRACTURES
29	COMMUNITIES OF INTEREST IN HOUSE DISTRICTS 21, 23, 77, 78, 82, AND 84; AND
30	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives contends that pairings of House Districts made to form Senate

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Districts fracture communities of interest, particularly the assignments of House Districts 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, and 79 in Deer Lodge, Jefferson, and Silver Bow Counties; and

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives contends that holdover Senators Kaufmann and Webb have been assigned to Senate Districts predominantly composed of citizens who have never had the opportunity to vote for these officials, when it is possible to assign them to districts that include significant populations from their original Senate Districts Senator Webb is assigned to a Senate District predominantly composed of citizens who have never had the opportunity to vote for him, when it is possible to assign him to a district that includes significant populations from his original Senate District; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature is required to return the plan to the Commission with its recommendations on or before February 7, 2013.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That the House of Representatives urges the passage of amendments necessary for the Legislative Redistricting Plan to conform to the Commission's established criteria. To this end, the House of Representatives recommends that the Commission consider the following amendments:

- (1) redraw House Districts 24 and 25 21 AND 23 in Cascade County, House Districts 47, 48, 49, and 50 in Yellowstone County, House District 66 in Gallatin County, House District 81 DISTRICTS 82 AND 84 in Lewis and Clark County, and House District 96 in Missoula County to better meet the standard of a general appearance test regarding compactness. A compact district would be more square-like, as opposed to a long rectangle.
- 21 (2) REDRAW HOUSE DISTRICT 13 AND ANY SURROUNDING DISTRICTS AS NECESSARY TO CREATE DISTRICTS IN
 22 THE AREA THAT ARE FUNCTIONALLY COMPACT;
 - (2)(3) preserve both compactness and communities of interest by reassigning the following House Districts into Senate District pairings: House Districts 73 and 76, House Districts 74 and 77, and House Districts 75 and 78. The House District lines for Districts 74 and 77 should be moved together in order to meet the contiguous standard in the Commission's criteria.
 - (4) REDRAW HOUSE DISTRICTS 77 AND 78 TO KEEP THE TOWN OF ANACONDA WHOLE; AND
- 28 (3)(5) reassign the following holdover Senators to Senate Districts that include the communities from which they were originally elected:
 - (a) Senator Kaufmann from Senate District 40 to Senate District 41; and



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1 (b) Senator Webb from Senate District 23 to Senate District 22.

2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be kept on file by the Secretary of State and

that copies be sent by the Secretary of State to the presiding officer and each member of the Montana Districting

4 and Apportionment Commission.
