Districts fracture communities of interest, particularly the assignments of House Districts 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, and 1 2 79 in Deer Lodge, Jefferson, and Silver Bow Counties; and 3 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives contends that holdover Senators Kaufmann and Webb have 4 been assigned to Senate Districts predominantly composed of citizens who have never had the opportunity to 5 vote for these officials, when it is possible to assign them to districts that include significant populations from their 6 original Senate Districts SENATOR WEBB IS ASSIGNED TO A SENATE DISTRICT PREDOMINANTLY COMPOSED OF CITIZENS 7 WHO HAVE NEVER HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO VOTE FOR HIM, WHEN IT IS POSSIBLE TO ASSIGN HIM TO A DISTRICT THAT 8 INCLUDES SIGNIFICANT POPULATIONS FROM HIS ORIGINAL SENATE DISTRICT; and 9 WHEREAS, the Legislature is required to return the plan to the Commission with its recommendations 10 on or before February 7, 2013. 11 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF 13 MONTANA: 14 That the House of Representatives urges the passage of amendments necessary for the Legislative 15 Redistricting Plan to conform to the Commission's established criteria. To this end, the House of Representatives 16 recommends that the Commission consider the following amendments: 17 (1) redraw House Districts 24 and 25 21 AND 23 in Cascade County, House Districts 47, 48, 49, and 50 18 in Yellowstone County, House District 66 in Gallatin County, House District 81 DISTRICTS 82 AND 84 in Lewis and 19 Clark County, and House District 96 in Missoula County to better meet the standard of a general appearance test 20 regarding compactness. A compact district would be more square-like, as opposed to a long rectangle. 21 (2) REDRAW HOUSE DISTRICT 13 AND ANY SURROUNDING DISTRICTS AS NECESSARY TO CREATE DISTRICTS IN 22 THE AREA THAT ARE FUNCTIONALLY COMPACT; 23 (2)(3)(2) preserve both compactness and communities of interest by reassigning the following House 24 Districts into Senate District pairings: House Districts 73 and 76, House Districts 74 and 77, and House Districts 25 75 and 78. The House District lines for Districts 74 and 77 should be moved together in order to meet the 26 contiguous standard in the Commission's criteria. 27 (4)(3) REDRAW HOUSE DISTRICTS 77 AND 78 TO KEEP THE TOWN OF ANACONDA WHOLE; AND 28 (3)(5)(4) reassign the following holdover Senators to Senate Districts that include the communities from 29 which they were originally elected: 30 (a) Senator Kaufmann from Senate District 40 to Senate District 41; and Legislative
