10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12	Section 1. Section 75-11-503, MCA, is amended to read:
13	"75-11-503. Definitions. Unless the context requires otherwise, in this part, the following definitions

16	(2) "Department" means the department of environmental quality provided for in 2-15-3501.

18	of any regulated substance into or onto the land or water so that the regulated substance or any constituent of
19	the regulated substance may enter the environment or be emitted into the air or discharged into any waters,

21	(4) "Person" means the United States, an individual, firm, trust, estate, partnership, company,
22	association, corporation, city, town, local governmental entity, or any other governmental or private entity, whether
23	organized for profit or not.
24	(5) "Petroleum mixing zone" means an area where water quality standards for petroleum and petroleum
25	constituents may be exceeded subject to the conditions of 75-11-508 and consistent with rules adopted under
26	75-11-318, 75-11-319, and 75-11-505.
27	(6) "Regulated substance":
