4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING CRITERIA FOR THE TRANSPLANTATION OF
5	MOUNTAIN SHEEP; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
8	
9	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Criteria for transplantation of mountain sheep legislative intent
10	<b><u>DEFINITION</u></b> . (1) It is the legislature's intent that the requirements of this section ensure that mountain sheep
11	transplantation projects:
12	(a) are implemented in areas where transplantation is likely to be successful for the species, with an
13	emphasis on avoiding conflicts in existing land management practices and competition between mountain sheep
14	and other species that may be detrimental to the success of the project;
15	(b) incorporate sound science, public and local government involvement and cooperation, and adequate
16	planning;
17	(c) are conducted in a manner that respects and preserves private property rights; and
18	(d) are implemented only after it is determined that transplantation of mountain sheep will not jeopardize
19	existing domestic sheep grazing allotments and after proper protections are made to ensure that the department
20	assumes financial responsibility for efforts to keep mountain sheep and domestic sheep separate.
21	(2) Land on which the department is proposing to transplant mountain sheep must:
22	(a) be located within historic mountain sheep habitat as identified by the department in its most recent
23	mountain sheep conservation strategy;
24	(b)(A) contain sufficient winter and other seasonal range capacity to support the anticipated population
25	size; and
26	(c)(B) be at least 65% 51% publicly owned or managed.
27	(3) The department may not transplant mountain sheep:
28	(a) if domestic sheep or domestic goat operations exist within the proposed transplantation area or in
29	the immediate surrounding area WITHIN 15 MILES OF ITS BOUNDARY UNLESS ADEQUATE MITIGATION MEASURES ARE
30	IN PLACE TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF PNEUMONIA AND DISEASE AND PRECLUDE COMMINGLING OF MOUNTAIN SHEEP WITH

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(b) if transplantation would negatively impact existing multiple uses of public land in the transplantation area, including grazing; or

- (c) without preparing a comprehensive management plan that:
- (i) clearly identifies the proposed transplantation area AND THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF MOUNTAIN SHEEP PROPOSED IN THE RESULTING POPULATION;
- (ii) provides for the expeditious removal of mountain sheep that commingle with domestic sheep or domestic goats;
- (iii) provides for the expeditious removal or relocation of mountain sheep that <u>OR PROMPT MITIGATION</u>

  <u>REMEDIES IF THE SHEEP</u> cause damage to private property or <u>TO</u> agriculture or livestock operations <u>OR JEOPARDIZE</u>

  <u>PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY, INCLUDING CAUSING A TRAFFIC HAZARD</u>;
- (iv) provides for the expeditious removal or relocation of mountain sheep that become permanently established outside of their designated transplantation area <u>OR MITIGATION BY MUTUAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT AND THE AFFECTED PARTIES</u>; and
- (v) identifies a long-term, stable funding source to be used for future management actions related to the transplantation effort.
- (4) When proposing the transplantation of mountain sheep, the department shall prepare an environmental review pursuant to Title 75, chapter 1, part 2, including a public scoping process. As part of the public scoping process, the department shall:
- (a) consult and coordinate with county commissioners in the affected counties <u>TO ENSURE LOCAL</u>

  GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL CITIZENS IN OR NEAR THE AFFECTED AREAS ARE GIVEN ADEQUATE OPPORTUNITIES TO BECOME

  INFORMED OF THE PROPOSED PROJECT AND TO MEANINGFULLY PARTICIPATE IN THE PUBLIC SCOPING PROCESS, AND THAT

  LOCAL CONSIDERATIONS ARE PROPERLY REFLECTED IN RELATED DECISIONS;
- (b) hold a public meeting GENERAL INFORMATIONAL MEETINGS in each county in which the transplantation would occur; and
- (c) give written notification of the proposed transplantation to all landowners within the proposed transplantation area. The notice must include information about opportunities for submitting public comment and list all public meetings scheduled in the affected county or counties.
- (C) GIVE ADVANCE WRITTEN NOTIFICATION BY CERTIFIED MAIL TO ALL PARTIES OWNING OR LEASING LANDS WITHIN
  THE PROPOSED TRANSPLANTATION AREA. THE NOTICE MUST SUMMARIZE THE PROPOSED TRANSPLANTATION PROJECT,



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1	PROVIDE A MAP OF THE PROPOSED TRANSPLANTATION AREA, PROVIDE INFORMATION ABOUT OPPORTUNITIES FOR
2	SUBMITTING PUBLIC COMMENT, IDENTIFY ADVERSE IMPACTS THAT COULD RESULT FROM THE PROJECT, LIST ALL RELATED
3	PUBLIC MEETINGS SCHEDULED IN THE AFFECTED COUNTY OR COUNTIES, AND BE GIVEN AT LEAST 30 DAYS PRIOR TO
4	COMMENCEMENT OF THE PUBLIC SCOPING PROCESS.
5	(5) In addition to the requirements of Title 75, chapter 1, part 2, and subsection (4) of this section, any
6	environmental review prepared for the proposed transplantation of mountain sheep must include:
7	(a) ANY AVAILABLE disease surveillance and demographic modeling data for the mountain sheep herd
8	from which sheep would be transplanted; and
9	(b) analysis of the impacts of the comprehensive management plan prepared pursuant to subsection
10	(3)(c).
11	(6) Before transplantation of mountain sheep is approved, the department shall:
12	(a) obtain written permission from:
13	(i) landowners holding ATLEAST 80% of the private land located within the proposed transplantation area;
14	and
15	(ii) landowners whose property is specifically identified or utilized by the proposed transplantation project;
16	and
17	(b) consult and coordinate with THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, the department of agriculture, and
18	the department of livestock if the transplantation will impact TRAFFIC SAFETY OR agriculture or livestock operations
19	in the transplantation area or the surrounding area AND RECONCILE ANY SIGNIFICANT INCONSISTENCIES IN PLANS,
20	POLICIES, OR ACTIONS PRIOR TO PROCEEDING.
21	(7) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "TRANSPLANTATION AREA" MEANS ALL LANDS EXPECTED TO BE USED BY THE
22	RESULTING MOUNTAIN SHEEP POPULATION, DEPICTED BY AN OUTER BOUNDARY OF IDENTIFIED GEOGRAPHIC FEATURES.

24	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
25	integral part of Title 87, chapter 5, part 7, and the provisions of Title 87, chapter 5, part 7, apply to [section 1].

27	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
