4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING PERMITTING A QUERY OF THE PRESCRIPTION
5	DRUG REGISTRY PRIOR TO PRESCRIBING A SCHEDULE II OR SCHEDULE III DRUG FOR TREATMENT
6	OF A WORKERS' COMPENSATION INJURY OR OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE; AND PROVIDING A DELAYED
7	AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Schedule II and III drugs prescriber obligation. (1) In order to ensure
12	high-quality health care for an individual with a compensable occupational injury or disease, prescriptions for
13	Schedule II or Schedule III drugs identified in Title 50, chapter 32, part 2, must MAY be carefully monitored for
14	potential abuse, dependence, interaction, and diversion. $\underline{ONGOING PRESCRIPTIONS FOR SCHEDULE II AND SCHEDULE}$
15	HI drugs may be prescribed only by a treating physician. Ongoing prescriptions for Schedule II and
16	SCHEDULE III DRUGS MAY BE PRESCRIBED ONLY BY A TREATING PHYSICIAN.
17	(2) (a) A health care provider TREATING PHYSICIAN authorized to prescribe prescription drugs shall MAY
18	query the prescription drug registry provided for in Title 37, chapter 7, part 15, prior to the initial prescribing OR
19	REFILLING of a Schedule II or Schedule III drug for treatment of a workers' compensation injury or occupational
20	disease. After consulting the prescription drug registry, a treating physician may decline to prescribe
21	OR REFILL A SCHEDULE II OR SCHEDULE III DRUG IF, IN THE TREATING PHYSICIAN'S JUDGMENT, THE DRUG SHOULD NOT
22	BE PRESCRIBED OR REFILLED.
23	(b) Prior to the initial prescribing of a Schedule II or Schedule III drug, a health care provider shall
24	TREATING PHYSICIAN MAY discuss the risks and benefits of the use of the controlled substance, including risk of
25	tolerance and drug dependence, with the patient or the patient's legal guardian.
26	(c) A health care provider prescribing a Schedule II or Schedule III drug shall query the prescription drug
27	registry not less than 90 days before issuing any new prescription or refill for a Schedule II or Schedule III drug.
28	(d)(C) A record of each query must be maintained in the patient's medical file TREATING PHYSICIAN SHALL
29	NOTE IN THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL FILE EACH QUERY CONDUCTED.
30	(3) This section does not apply to a health care provider TREATING PHYSICIAN HEALTH CARE PROVIDER

2	(a) immediately prior to <u>OR AFTER</u> surgery;
3	(b) at the scene of an emergency;
4	(c) in a licensed ambulance; or
5	(d) in the emergency department or intensive care unit of a licensed hospital.

7	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
8	integral part of Title 39, chapter 71, part 11, and the provisions of Title 39, chapter 71, part 11, apply to [section
9	1].
