6	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
7	MONTANA RECOMMENDING INTERIM MONITORING ACTIVITIES BY LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATIVE AND
8	INTERIM COMMITTEES AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT SUBCOMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE
9	APPROPRIATIONS AND SENATE FINANCE AND CLAIMS STANDING COMMITTEES.

11	WHEREAS, appropriations power is vested in the Legislature by the Montana Constitution; and
12	WHEREAS, the act of appropriating funds is one of the most significant expressions of legislative policy
13	and
14	WHEREAS, the 2013 Legislature evaluated critical goals for agency operations as part of the
15	appropriations process; and
16	WHEREAS, interim legislative committees are charged with program evaluation and monitoring functions
17	for specific state agencies; and
18	WHEREAS, performance monitoring has the potential to communicate what is received in return for the
19	investment of tax dollars; and
20	WHEREAS, through performance monitoring, both agency personnel and policymakers may gair
21	understanding of program effectiveness instead of focusing on the preservation of existing programs and
22	associated spending levels; and
23	WHEREAS, performance monitoring helps explain the results of previous legislative funding decisions
24	and aids in priority setting; and
25	WHEREAS, performance monitoring helps estimate and justify the potential consequences of new
26	funding decisions; and
27	WHEREAS, regular performance monitoring before and during budget deliberations encourages deeper
28	legislative understanding of agency activities and may even garner support for them; and
29	WHEREAS, effective performance monitoring is a partnership between the Executive, Judicial, and
30	Legislative Branches of state government.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE

2 STATE OF MONTANA:

That the Legislative Finance Committee, in cooperation with the Legislative Council, be requested to recommend to appropriate administrative or interim committees, pursuant to section 5-5-217, MCA, interim monitoring activities as recommended by the Joint Subcommittees on Appropriations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Judicial Branch requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the Court Help Program, including reporting on statistics that shows the incomes of users of the program and quantifiable impacts of the program on court efficiencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Department of Corrections requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the costs and usage of the contract with the Department of Public Health and Human Services for housing inmates at the Montana Mental Health Nursing Care Center in Lewistown.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Department of Corrections requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the average daily population of offenders under the supervision of the Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Office of State Public Defender requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor staff turnover, including trends and statistics of staff turnover and stated reasons for leaving employment with the Office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Office of State Public Defender requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor expenditure of funding provided for death penalty defense, including reporting on cost, payment rates, hours billed, and names of service providers of contracted legal representation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Department of Justice requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor trends on enforcing the provisions of section 61-3-701, MCA.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Department of Administration, State Accounting Division, requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the lowering of fees for the Local Government Audit and Reporting Program. This includes monitoring the reduction of excess fund balance in the related proprietary fund to determine what fees are commensurate

with the costs of operating the program. The Legislative Fiscal Division shall prepare a report on the progress of the program to the Joint Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government of the 2015 Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the State Information Technology Services Division requests that the Energy and Telecommunications Interim Committee monitor its progress in development of the FirstNet Planning Grant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Commissioner of Political Practices requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the impact of hiring agency legal counsel, including increases in the number of investigation and decisions issued, reductions in the time to resolve complaints, and reductions in the time to provide decisions. The Legislative Fiscal Division shall prepare a report on the increases and reductions to the Joint Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government of the 2015 Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Department of Military Affairs requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the ChalleNGe Program's actions to address its recruitment and retention challenges. The Legislative Fiscal Division shall prepare a report on the progress to the Joint Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government of the 2015 Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Joint Subcommittees' recommendation for interim monitoring of the Department of Public Health and Human Services requests that the Legislative Finance Committee monitor the outcomes of the Medicaid Incentive Grant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review requirements, be concluded prior to October 1, 2014.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions, comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee, be reported to the 64th Legislature.
