4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT GENERALLY REVISING TAXATION OF INCOME, INCLUDING THE
5 CORPORATE ~~LICENSE~~ INCOME TAX; REQUIRING THE TAXATION OF INDIVIDUALS, PARTNERSHIPS, AND
6 SUBCHAPTER S. CORPORATIONS, INCLUDING TRUSTS AND ESTATES, TO RELATE THE STATE
7 INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX TO FEDERAL TAXABLE INCOME; PROVIDING ADJUSTMENTS TO FEDERAL
8 TAXABLE INCOME TO INCLUDE CERTAIN INCOME; PROVIDING ADJUSTMENTS TO FEDERAL TAXABLE

23 AND AN APPLICATION FEE FOR A PRODUCTION COMPANY TO CLAIM TAX CREDITS FOR A

25 ADMINISTERING THE TAX CREDITS; PROVIDING A STATUTORY APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

14

15 NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Adjustments to federal taxable income to determine Montana taxable**
 16 **income.** (1) The items in subsection (2) are added to and the items in subsection (3) are subtracted from federal
 17 taxable income to determine Montana taxable income.

18 (2) The following are added to federal taxable income:

19 (a) to the extent that it is not exempt from taxation by Montana under federal law, interest from
 20 obligations of a territory or another state or any political subdivision of a territory or another state and
 21 exempt-interest dividends attributable to that interest except to the extent already included in federal taxable
 22 income;

23 (b) a withdrawal from a medical care savings account provided for in Title 15, chapter 61, used for a
 24 purpose other than an eligible medical expense or long-term care of the employee or account holder or a
 25 dependent of the employee or account holder;

26 (c) a nonqualified withdrawal from a family education savings account provided for in Title 15, chapter
 27 62, to the extent that it was deducted from income in calculating Montana individual income taxes;

28 (d) a withdrawal from a first-time home buyer savings account provided for in Title 15, chapter 63, used
 29 for a purpose other than for eligible costs for the purchase of a single-family residence;

30 (e) an item of income, deduction, or expense to the extent that it was used to calculate federal taxable

1 income if the item was also used to calculate a credit against a Montana income tax liability;

2 (f) a deduction or expense upon which a state tax credit is computed under 33-22-2006 to the extent that
3 it was included as a deduction or expense in determining federal taxable income;

4 (g) a deduction for an income distribution from an estate or trust to a beneficiary that was included in the
5 federal taxable income of an estate or trust in accordance with sections 651 and 661 of the Internal Revenue
6 Code, 26 U.S.C. 651 and 661; and

7 (h) for a taxpayer that deducts state income taxes pursuant to section 164(a)(3) of the Internal Revenue
8 Code, 26 U.S.C. 164(a)(3), an additional amount equal to the state income tax deduction claimed, not to exceed
9 the amount required to reduce the federal itemized amount computed under section 161 of the Internal Revenue
10 Code, 26 U.S.C. 161, to the amount of the federal standard deduction allowable under section 63(c) of the
11 Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. 63(c).

12 (3) To the extent they are included as income or gain or not already excluded as a deduction or expense
13 in determining federal taxable income, the following are subtracted from federal taxable income:

14 (a) if exempt from taxation by Montana under federal law:

15 (i) interest from obligations of the United States government and exempt-interest dividends attributable
16 to that interest; and

17 (ii) railroad retirement benefits;

18 (b) salary received from the armed forces by residents who entered into active duty from Montana and
19 are serving on active duty in the regular armed forces;

20 (c) interest and other income related to contributions that were made prior to January 1, 2016, that are
21 retained in a medical care savings account provided for in Title 15, chapter 61, and any withdrawal for payment
22 of eligible medical expenses or for the long-term care of the employee or account holder or a dependent of the
23 employee or account holder;

24 (d) interest and other income related to contributions that were made prior to January 1, 2016, that are
25 retained in a family education savings account provided for in Title 15, chapter 62, and any qualified withdrawal
26 for payment of qualified higher education expenses;

27 (e) interest and other income related to contributions that were made prior to January 1, 2016, that are
28 retained in a first-time home buyer savings account provided for in Title 15, chapter 63, and any withdrawal for
29 payment of eligible costs for the first-time purchase of a single-family residence;

30 (f) a deduction for an income distribution from an estate or trust to a beneficiary in accordance with

1 sections 651 and 661 of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. 651 and 661, recalculated according to the
 2 additions and subtractions in subsections (2) and (3)(a) through (3)(e) and (3)(g) AND (3)(H); and

3 (g) for each taxpayer that has attained the age of 65, an additional subtraction of \$6,400; AND

4 (H) THE AMOUNT OF ANY REFUND OR CREDIT FOR OVERPAYMENT OF INCOME TAXES IMPOSED BY THIS STATE OR
 5 ANY OTHER TAXING JURISDICTION TO THE EXTENT INCLUDED IN GROSS INCOME FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES BUT
 6 NOT PREVIOUSLY ALLOWED AS A DEDUCTION FOR MONTANA INCOME TAX PURPOSES.

7 (4) By November 1 of each year, the department shall multiply the subtraction from federal taxable
 8 income for a taxpayer that has attained the age of 65 contained in subsection (3)(g) by the inflation factor for that
 9 tax year, rounding the result to the nearest \$10. The resulting amount is effective for that tax year and must be
 10 used as the basis for the subtraction from federal taxable income determined under subsection (3)(g).

 12 NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. SHORT TITLE. [SECTIONS 2 THROUGH 11] MAY BE CITED AS THE "BIG SKY ON THE
 13 BIG SCREEN ACT".

 15 NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. PURPOSE. (1) THE PURPOSES OF [SECTIONS 2 THROUGH 11] ARE TO ENHANCE
 16 MONTANA'S ECONOMY BY REVITALIZING AND EXPANDING THE MOTION PICTURE AND TELEVISION INDUSTRIES AND RELATED
 17 MEDIA IN MONTANA AND TO PROMOTE THE GROWTH OF SMALL BUSINESSES. THE OBJECTIVES OF [SECTIONS 2 THROUGH
 18 11] ARE TO:

19 (A) RENEW INTEREST IN MONTANA AS A PREMIER LOCATION FOR THE PRODUCTION OF MOTION PICTURES,
 20 DOCUMENTARIES, TELEVISION PROGRAMS AND COMMERCIALS, AND MAGAZINE ADVERTISING;

21 (B) ENCOURAGE THE CREATION OF JOBS THAT PAY WELL FOR MONTANA WORKERS AND UNIVERSITY GRADUATES;

22 (C) ENHANCE THE GROWTH OF MONTANA BUSINESSES THAT PROVIDE GOODS AND SERVICES FOR THESE TYPES
 23 OF PRODUCTIONS; AND

24 (D) HELP PROMOTE THE TOURISM INDUSTRY IN MONTANA.

25 (2) THE OBJECTIVES IN SUBSECTION (1) WILL BEST BE ACHIEVED BY OFFERING TAX INCENTIVES TO PRODUCTION
 26 COMPANIES FOR HIRING MONTANA RESIDENTS AND FOR PURCHASING MONTANA GOODS AND SERVICES.

27
 28 NEW SECTION. SECTION 4. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN [SECTIONS 2 THROUGH 11], UNLESS THE CONTEXT
 29 REQUIRES OTHERWISE, THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS APPLY:

30 (1) "COMPENSATION" MEANS SALARY, WAGES, OR OTHER COMPENSATION, INCLUDING RELATED BENEFITS PAID

1 TO A MONTANA RESIDENT.

2 (2) (A) "PRODUCTION" MEANS A NATIONALLY OR REGIONALLY DISTRIBUTED FEATURE-LENGTH FILM, SHORT FILM,
3 DOCUMENTARY, TELEVISION SERIES OR SEGMENT, TELEVISION PILOT, MAGAZINE ADVERTISING OTHER THAN ADVERTISING
4 FOR TOBACCO PRODUCTS, OR COMMERCIAL MADE IN MONTANA, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, FOR THEATRICAL, TELEVISION,
5 VIDEO, INTERNET, OR OTHER VIEWING.

6 (B) THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE THE PRODUCTION OF TELEVISION COVERAGE OF NEWS AND ATHLETIC EVENTS
7 OR A FILM, VIDEO, INTERNET PRODUCTION, TELEVISION SERIES, MAGAZINE ADVERTISING, OR COMMERCIAL THAT:

8 (I) CONTAINS ANY OBSCENE MATERIAL OR PERFORMANCE AS DESCRIBED IN 45-8-201(2); OR

9 (II) IS PRODUCED IN WHOLE OR IN PART WITH MONEY RECEIVED FOR TOBACCO PRODUCT PLACEMENT,
10 ADVERTISEMENT, OR OTHER TOBACCO USE IN THE PRODUCTION.

11 (3) (A) "PRODUCTION COMPANY" MEANS A COMPANY ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF PRODUCING NATIONALLY
12 OR REGIONALLY DISTRIBUTED PRODUCTIONS.

13 (B) THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE A COMPANY OWNED, AFFILIATED, OR CONTROLLED BY, IN WHOLE OR IN PART,
14 A COMPANY OR PERSON THAT IS IN DEFAULT ON A LOAN MADE BY THIS STATE OR A LOAN GUARANTEED BY THIS STATE OR
15 A COMPANY OR PERSON THAT HAS FILED FOR BANKRUPTCY.

16 (4) (A) "QUALIFIED EXPENDITURES" MEANS EXPENDITURES IN MONTANA MADE BY A PRODUCTION COMPANY THAT
17 ARE DIRECTLY RELATED TO A STATE-CERTIFIED PRODUCTION. THE TERM INCLUDES EXPENDITURES FOR LODGING
18 EXPENSES, RESTAURANT AND FOOD EXPENSES, LOCATION FEES, LUMBER AND CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, RENTAL OF
19 PRODUCTION EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLES, AND SUPPLIES AND MATERIALS THAT WILL BE USED IN THE PRODUCTION.

20 (B) THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE EXPENDITURES MADE FOR GOODS AND SERVICES OBTAINED OUT OF STATE.

21 (5) "RESIDENT" OR "MONTANA RESIDENT", FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR THE TAX CREDIT
22 PROVIDED UNDER [SECTION 8], HAS THE MEANING PROVIDED IN 15-30-2101.

23 (6) "STATE-CERTIFIED PRODUCTION" MEANS A PRODUCTION CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AS
24 PROVIDED IN [SECTION 5] AND PRODUCED BY A PRODUCTION COMPANY THAT HAS A NATIONAL OR REGIONAL DISTRIBUTION
25 PLAN, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO A MAJOR THEATRICAL EXHIBITION, FILM FESTIVAL, TELEVISION NETWORK, CABLE
26 TELEVISION PROGRAMMING, MAGAZINE ADVERTISING, OR VIDEO OR INTERNET DISTRIBUTION.

27
28 NEW SECTION. SECTION 5. APPLICATION FOR STATE CERTIFICATION -- APPROVAL -- REVOCATION --
29 ELIGIBILITY FOR TAX CREDITS -- RULES. (1) A PRODUCTION COMPANY MAY NOT RECEIVE THE TAX CREDITS ALLOWED
30 UNDER [SECTIONS 8 AND 9] UNLESS THE PRODUCTION HAS BEEN CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, AS



1 PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, AND HAS APPLIED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE FOR THE TAX CREDITS AS PROVIDED IN
2 [SECTION 7]. THE CERTIFICATION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE MUST OCCUR WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER SUBMISSION
3 OF THE APPLICATION UNDER THIS SECTION.

4 (2) AN APPLICATION, ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, MUST BE SUBMITTED BY THE
5 PRODUCTION COMPANY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE BEFORE THE START OF PRINCIPAL PHOTOGRAPHY. THE
6 APPLICATION MUST INCLUDE:

7 (A) THE PRODUCTION COMPANY'S NAME, PRIMARY HOME ADDRESS, BUSINESS ADDRESS, TELEPHONE AND FAX
8 NUMBERS, INCORPORATION INFORMATION, AND FEDERAL TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER;

9 (B) THE ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE AND FAX NUMBERS OF THE PRODUCTION COMPANY'S MONTANA OFFICE;

10 (C) THE NAME OF THE LINE PRODUCER, UNIT PRODUCTION MANAGER, OR PRODUCTION ACCOUNTANT OR THE
11 NAMES OF ALL THREE;

12 (D) A STATEMENT THAT THE APPLICANT MEETS THE DEFINITION OF A PRODUCTION COMPANY UNDER [SECTION
13 4];

14 (E) THE TITLE OF THE PRODUCTION;

15 (F) THE TYPE OF PRODUCTION;

16 (G) THE PROPOSED DATES OF PRODUCTION FROM PREPRODUCTION TO THE START AND COMPLETION OF
17 PRINCIPAL PHOTOGRAPHY;

18 (H) A COPY OR SYNOPSIS OF THE PRODUCTION SCRIPT;

19 (I) A LIST OF THE PRODUCTION LOCATIONS;

20 (J) A STATEMENT THAT THE PROPOSED PRODUCTION:

21 (i) DOES NOT CONTAIN ANY MATERIAL OR PERFORMANCE THAT WOULD BE CONSIDERED OBSCENE UNDER
22 45-8-201(2); OR

23 (ii) WILL NOT RECEIVE ANY MONEY FOR TOBACCO PRODUCT PLACEMENT, ADVERTISEMENT, OR OTHER TOBACCO
24 USE IN THE PRODUCTION; AND

25 (K) IF THE PRODUCTION IS A FEATURE-LENGTH FILM, A STATEMENT THAT THE PRODUCTION WILL INCLUDE A LINE
26 IN THE PRODUCTION'S FILM CREDITS THAT THE PRODUCTION WAS FILMED IN MONTANA.

27 (3) THE APPLICATION MUST BE SIGNED BY THE MANAGER, AGENT, PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, OR OTHER
28 PERSON AUTHORIZED TO REPRESENT THE PRODUCTION COMPANY.

29 (4) (A) THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE SHALL NOTIFY THE APPLICANT WITHIN 30 DAYS OF RECEIPT OF THE
30 APPLICATION AS TO WHETHER THE PRODUCTION QUALIFIES AS A STATE-CERTIFIED PRODUCTION.

1 (B) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (4)(B)(II), IF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE APPROVES THE APPLICATION, THE
 2 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE SHALL PROVIDE A CERTIFICATION NUMBER TO THE APPLICANT AND NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT
 3 OF REVENUE OF THE APPROVAL AND CERTIFICATION NUMBER.

4 (II) IF THE PRODUCTION IS A FEATURE-LENGTH FILM, THE PRODUCTION COMPANY AND THE DEPARTMENT OF
 5 COMMERCE, PRIOR TO THE ISSUANCE OF THE CERTIFICATION NUMBER, SHALL ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT THAT THE
 6 PRODUCTION COMPANY WILL COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (2)(K). THE AGREEMENT MAY PROVIDE FOR
 7 REMEDIES IF THE PRODUCTION COMPANY VIOLATES THE AGREEMENT.

8 (5) IF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE DETERMINES THAT THE PRODUCTION COMPANY HAS VIOLATED THE
 9 PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (2)(D) OR (2)(J), THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE MAY REVOKE THE STATE CERTIFICATION
 10 OF THE PRODUCTION. IF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE REVOKES THE STATE CERTIFICATION, THE DEPARTMENT OF
 11 COMMERCE SHALL NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE. THE PRODUCTION COMPANY HAS THE RIGHT TO A HEARING
 12 UNDER TITLE 2, CHAPTER 4, PART 6.

13 (6) THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE SHALL PRESCRIBE RULES, INCLUDING A PROCEDURE FOR REVIEW OF THAT
 14 DEPARTMENT'S DENIAL OR REVOCATION OF STATE CERTIFICATION, NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
 15 SECTION.

16
 17 **NEW SECTION. SECTION 6. SUBMISSION OF COSTS.** WITHIN 60 DAYS OF COMPLETION OF PRINCIPAL
 18 PHOTOGRAPHY, THE PRODUCTION COMPANY SHALL SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT A STATEMENT OF ALL EXPENDITURES
 19 AND COMPENSATION PAID TO MONTANA RESIDENTS.

20
 21 **NEW SECTION. SECTION 7. APPLICATION FOR TAX CREDIT -- FEE.** (1) TO RECEIVE THE TAX CREDITS UNDER
 22 [SECTIONS 8 AND 9] FOR A STATE-CERTIFIED PRODUCTION, A PRODUCTION COMPANY SHALL APPLY TO THE DEPARTMENT
 23 ON A FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT. THE FORM MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN APPLICATION FEE. THE
 24 APPLICATION MUST BE MADE AND THE FEE PAID AT THE TIME THE PRODUCTION COMPANY FILES ITS TAX RETURN.

25 (2) THE APPLICATION FEE IS \$500.

26 (3) THE FEE MUST BE DEPOSITED IN THE STATE SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNT. THE FEE IS STATUTORILY
 27 APPROPRIATED, AS PROVIDED IN 17-7-502, IN EQUAL AMOUNTS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND THE DEPARTMENT
 28 OF COMMERCE TO ADMINISTER THE PROVISIONS OF [SECTION 5 AND SECTIONS 7 THROUGH 11].

29
 30 **NEW SECTION. SECTION 8. EMPLOYMENT PRODUCTION TAX CREDIT.** (1) A PRODUCTION COMPANY THAT HAS

1 SUBMITTED AN APPLICATION FOR A TAX CREDIT AND PAID THE FEE AS REQUIRED UNDER [SECTION 7] IS ALLOWED A TAX
 2 CREDIT AGAINST THE TAXES IMPOSED BY CHAPTER 30 OR 31 FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF RESIDENTS OF THIS STATE IN
 3 CONNECTION WITH A STATE-CERTIFIED PRODUCTION IN THE STATE. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (4)(B), THE
 4 CREDIT IS EQUAL TO CREDIT CARRYOVERS AND THE CREDIT FOR THE TAX YEAR.

6 (i) are not capable of supporting any one of the designated uses for their classification; or

7 (ii) have zero flow or surface expression for more than 270 days during most years.

8 (14) "Impaired water body" means a water body or stream segment for which sufficient credible data
9 shows that the water body or stream segment is failing to achieve compliance with applicable water quality
10 standards.

11 (15) "Industrial waste" means a waste substance from the process of business or industry or from the
12 development of any natural resource, together with any sewage that may be present.

13 (16) "Interested person" means a person who has a real property interest, a water right, or an economic
14 interest that is or may be directly and adversely affected by the department's preliminary decision regarding
15 degradation of state waters, pursuant to 75-5-303. The term includes a person who has requested authorization
16 to degrade high-quality waters.

17 (17) "Load allocation" means the portion of a receiving water's loading capacity that is allocated to one
18 of its existing or future nonpoint sources or to natural background sources.

19 (18) "Loading capacity" means the mass of a pollutant that a water body can assimilate without a violation
20 of water quality standards. For pollutants that cannot be measured in terms of mass, it means the maximum
21 change that can occur from the best practicable condition in a surface water without causing a violation of the
22 surface water quality standards.

23 (19) "Local department of health" means the staff, including health officers, employed by a county, city,
24 city-county, or district board of health.

25 (20) "Metal parameters" includes but is not limited to aluminum, antimony, arsenic, beryllium, barium,
26 cadmium, chromium, copper, fluoride, iron, lead, manganese, mercury, nickel, selenium, silver, thallium, and zinc.

27 (21) "Mixing zone" means an area established in a permit or final decision on nondegradation issued by
28 the department where water quality standards may be exceeded, subject to conditions that are imposed by the
29 department and that are consistent with the rules adopted by the board.

30 (22) "Nutrient standards variance" means numeric water quality criteria for nutrients based on a

1 determination that base numeric nutrient standards cannot be achieved because of economic impacts or because
2 of the limits of technology. The term includes individual, general, and alternative nutrient standards variances in
3 accordance with 75-5-313.

4 (23) "Nutrient work group" means an advisory work group, convened by the department, representing
5 publicly owned and privately owned point sources of pollution, nonpoint sources of pollution, and other interested
6 parties that will advise the department on the base numeric nutrient standards, the development of nutrient
7 standards variances, and the implementation of those standards and variances together with associated
8 economic impacts.

9 (24) "Other wastes" means garbage, municipal refuse, decayed wood, sawdust, shavings, bark, lime,
10 sand, ashes, offal, night soil, oil, grease, tar, heat, chemicals, dead animals, sediment, wrecked or discarded
11 equipment, radioactive materials, solid waste, and all other substances that may pollute state waters.

12 (25) "Outstanding resource waters" means:

13 (a) state surface waters located wholly within the boundaries of areas designated as national parks or
14 national wilderness areas as of October 1, 1995; or

15 (b) other surface waters or ground waters classified by the board under the provisions of 75-5-316 and
16 approved by the legislature.

17 (26) "Owner or operator" means a person who owns, leases, operates, controls, or supervises a point
18 source.

19 (27) "Parameter" means a physical, biological, or chemical property of state water when a value of that
20 property affects the quality of the state water.

21 (28) "Person" means the state, a political subdivision of the state, institution, firm, corporation,
22 partnership, individual, or other entity and includes persons resident in Canada.

23 (29) "Point source" means a discernible, confined, and discrete conveyance, including but not limited to
24 any pipe, ditch, channel, tunnel, conduit, well, discrete fissure, container, rolling stock, or vessel or other floating
25 craft, from which pollutants are or may be discharged.

26 (30) (a) "Pollution" means:

27 (i) contamination or other alteration of the physical, chemical, or biological properties of state waters that
28 exceeds that permitted by Montana water quality standards, including but not limited to standards relating to
29 change in temperature, taste, color, turbidity, or odor; or

30 (ii) the discharge, seepage, drainage, infiltration, or flow of liquid, gaseous, solid, radioactive, or other

1 substance into state water that will or is likely to create a nuisance or render the waters harmful, detrimental, or
2 injurious to public health, recreation, safety, or welfare, to livestock, or to wild animals, birds, fish, or other wildlife.

3 (b) The term does not include:

4 (i) a discharge, seepage, drainage, infiltration, or flow that is authorized under the pollution discharge
5 permit rules adopted by the board under this chapter;

6 (ii) activities conducted under this chapter that comply with the conditions imposed by the department
7 in short-term authorizations pursuant to 75-5-308;

8 (iii) contamination of ground water within the boundaries of a geologic storage reservoir, as defined in
9 82-11-101, by a carbon dioxide injection well in accordance with a permit issued pursuant to Title 82, chapter 11,
10 part 1;

11 (iv) contamination of ground water within the boundaries of an underground mine using in situ coal
12 gasification and operating in accordance with a permit issued under 82-4-221;

13 (c) Contamination referred to in subsections (30)(b)(iii) and (30)(b)(iv) does not require a mixing zone.

14 (31) "Sewage" means water-carried waste products from residences, public buildings, institutions, or
15 other buildings, including discharge from human beings or animals, together with ground water infiltration and
16 surface water present.

17 (32) "Sewage system" means a device for collecting or conducting sewage, industrial wastes, or other
18 wastes to an ultimate disposal point.

19 (33) "Standard of performance" means a standard adopted by the board for the control of the discharge
20 of pollutants that reflects the greatest degree of effluent reduction achievable through application of the best
21 available demonstrated control technology, processes, operating methods, or other alternatives, including, when
22 practicable, a standard permitting no discharge of pollutants.

23 (34) (a) "State waters" means a body of water, irrigation system, or drainage system, either surface or
24 underground.

25 (b) The term does not apply to:

26 (i) ponds or lagoons used solely for treating, transporting, or impounding pollutants; or

27 (ii) irrigation waters or land application disposal waters when the waters are used up within the irrigation
28 or land application disposal system and the waters are not returned to state waters.

29 (35) "Sufficient credible data" means chemical, physical, or biological monitoring data, alone or in
30 combination with narrative information, that supports a finding as to whether a water body is achieving compliance

1 with applicable water quality standards.

2 (36) "Threatened water body" means a water body or stream segment for which sufficient credible data
3 and calculated increases in loads show that the water body or stream segment is fully supporting its designated
4 uses but threatened for a particular designated use because of:

5 (a) proposed sources that are not subject to pollution prevention or control actions required by a
6 discharge permit, the nondegradation provisions, or reasonable land, soil, and water conservation practices; or

7 (b) documented adverse pollution trends.

8 (37) "Total maximum daily load" or "TMDL" means the sum of the individual waste load allocations for
9 point sources and load allocations for both nonpoint sources and natural background sources established at a
10 level necessary to achieve compliance with applicable surface water quality standards.

11 (38) "Treatment works" means works, including sewage lagoons, installed for treating or holding sewage,
12 industrial wastes, or other wastes.

13 (39) "Waste load allocation" means the portion of a receiving water's loading capacity that is allocated
14 to one of its existing or future point sources.

15 (40) "Water quality protection practices" means those activities, prohibitions, maintenance procedures,
16 or other management practices applied to point and nonpoint sources designed to protect, maintain, and improve
17 the quality of state waters. Water quality protection practices include but are not limited to treatment requirements,
18 standards of performance, effluent standards, and operating procedures and practices to control site runoff,
19 spillage or leaks, sludge or water disposal, or drainage from material storage.

20 (41) "Water well" means an excavation that is drilled, cored, bored, washed, driven, dug, jetted, or
21 otherwise constructed and intended for the location, diversion, artificial recharge, or acquisition of ground water.

22 (42) "Watershed advisory group" means a group of individuals who wish to participate in an advisory

25 (iv) the father or mother of the member or an ancestor of either;

27 (vi) a son or daughter of a brother or sister of the member;

28 (vii) a brother or sister of the father or mother of the member;

29 (viii) a son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, or sister-in-law of the

1 (ix) an individual who has as the individual's principal place of abode the home of the member and is a
2 member of the member's household: or

3 (x) an individual who:

4 (A) is a descendant of a brother or sister of the father or mother of the member;

5 (B) for the calendar year under consideration, received institutional care required by reason of a physical
6 or mental disability; and

7 (C) before receiving the institutional care, was a member of the same household as the member.

8 (d) For purposes of subsection (1)(c):

9 (i) the terms "brother" and "sister" include a brother or sister by the half blood;

10 (ii) in determining whether any of the relationships specified exist, a legally adopted child of an individual
11 must be treated as a child of the individual by blood.

12 (2) A person who has physically resided in Montana as the person's principal or primary home or place
13 of abode for 180 consecutive days and who meets the criteria of subsection (4) immediately before making
14 application for any license is eligible to receive resident hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses. As used in this
15 section, a vacant lot or a premises used solely for business purposes is not considered a principal or primary
16 home or place of abode.

17 (3) A person who obtains residency under subsection (2) may continue to be a resident for purposes of
18 this section by physically residing in Montana as the person's principal or primary home or place of abode for not
19 less than 120 days a year and by meeting the criteria of subsection (4) prior to making application for any resident
20 hunting, fishing, or trapping license.

21 (4) In addition to the requirements of subsection (2) or (3), a person shall meet the following criteria to
22 be considered a resident for purposes of this section:

3 or (3) is considered a resident for purposes of this section.

4 (6) An enrollee of a job corps camp located within the state of Montana is, after a period of 30 days within
5 Montana, considered a resident for the purpose of making application for a fishing license as long as the person
6 remains an enrollee in a Montana camp.

7 (7) A person who does not reside in Montana but who meets all of the following requirements is a
8 resident for purposes of obtaining hunting and fishing licenses:

9 (a) The person's principal employment is within this state and the income from this employment is the
10 principal source of the applicant's family income.

11 (b) The person is required to pay and has paid Montana income tax in a timely manner and proper
12 amount.

13 (c) The person has been employed within this state on a full-time basis for at least 12 consecutive
14 months immediately preceding each application.

15 (d) The person's state of residency has laws substantially similar to this subsection (7).

16 (8) An unmarried minor is considered a resident for the purposes of this section if the minor's parents,

18 section. The minor is considered a resident for purposes of this section regardless of whether the minor resides
19 primarily in the state or otherwise qualifies as a resident. The resident parent or guardian of the minor may be
