The department of public health and human services is appropriated \$8,717,098 of general fund and \$16,418,709 of federal special revenue for FY 2016 if general fund medicaid benefit expenditures, including accruals, exceed \$295,652,291 by more than \$6,537,824. The appropriation may be used only to pay medicaid benefit expenditures made in FY 2016.

The department of public health and human services is appropriated \$2,932,580 of general fund and \$5,443,828 of federal special revenue for FY 2017 if general fund medicaid benefit expenditures, including accruals, exceed \$312,172,729 by no more than \$2,932,580. The appropriation may be used only to pay medicaid benefit expenditures made in FY 2017.

The department of public health and human services is appropriated \$5,865,159 of general fund and \$10,887,656 of federal special revenue for FY 2017 if general fund medicaid benefit expenditures, including accruals, exceed \$312,172,729 by more than \$5,865,159 but no more than \$8,209,355. The appropriation may be used only to pay medicaid benefit expenditures made in FY 2017.

The department of public health and human services is appropriated \$8,797,739 of general fund and \$16,331,484 of federal special revenue for FY 2017 if general fund medicaid benefit expenditures, including accruals, exceed \$312,172,729 by more than \$5,865,159 but no more than \$8,797,739. The appropriation may be used only to pay medicaid benefit expenditures made in FY 2017.

The department of public health and human services is appropriated \$11,730,318 of general fund and \$21,775,312 of federal special revenue for FY 2017 if general fund medicaid benefit expenditures, including accruals, exceed \$312,172,729 by more than \$8,797,739. The appropriation may be used only to pay medicaid benefit expenditures made in FY 2017.

The appropriations provided for in the preceding paragraphs are based on the amount of general fund medicaid benefit expenditures for fiscal years 2016 and 2017. The amounts of \$295,652,291

for FY 2016 and \$312,172,729 for FY 2017 are superseded by the total of general fund appropriations for each separate fiscal year as reflected in House Bill No. 2 as passed and approved.

The department of public health and human services is appropriated \$405,057 of general fund and \$5,406,374 of federal special revenue for FY 2016 if medical services funded from the federal children's health insurance program grant, including accruals and state matching funds, exceed \$97,141,601. The appropriation may be used only to pay for medical services funded from the federal children's health insurance program for expenditures made in FY 2016.

The department of public health and human services is appropriated \$611,659 of general fund and \$10,774,192 of federal special revenue for FY 2017 if medical services funded from the federal children's health insurance program grant, including accruals and state matching funds, exceed \$107,986,476. Dear President Barrett and Speaker Knudsen:

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby veto Senate Bill 241 (SB 241), "AN ACT PROHIBITING POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS FROM REQUIRING EMPLOYERS TO PROVIDE WAGES AND BENEFITS THAT ARE INCONSISTENT WITH STATE AND FEDERAL LAW; AMENDING SECTION 7-1-111, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

Montana is a state of great economic diversity: from the oil boom in the East, to the Main Streets of our cities, to the active tourism and natural resource industries in the West. Our local governments regularly respond to the demands of their communities and work to foster an economic environment that meets the needs of their region.

I trust local governments to balance the interests of workers and Main Street businesses and to make decisions that will ensure that their economies grow and thrive. By prohibiting political subdivisions from enacting minimum wage ordinances, SB 241 would constrain the flexibility of local governments to respond to the unique economic needs of their communities.

While I understand the concerns expressed by the proponents of SB 241, I do not believe that allowing local governments to make these types of decisions will negatively impact Montana's business climate. In fact, the national experience on this issue has demonstrated that businesses are able to adapt to varying minimum wage laws.

Businesses already accommodate differences between the federal minimum wage and those enacted by States. Additionally, according to a National Employment Law Project report published in 2014, at least 20 U.S. cities have adopted local minimum wage ordinances (*City Minimum Wage Laws: Recent Trends and Economic Evidence on Local Minimum Wage*, National Employment Law Project, 2014). That same report found that "the economic evidence regarding the higher city minimum wages that have been enacted in U.S. cities to date indicates that they have boosted earnings without evidence of slowed job growth or business relocations."

To date, no city in Montana has attempted to adopt a local minimum wage. However, I cannot support a bill that would remove that option for local governments who are in the best position to look at local conditions and needs in evaluating whether their community should enact ordinances

that strengthen their local economy. I have been an advocate for a living wage throughout my career and I do not believe protecting that option for locally elected governments will cause harm to Montana's business climate.

For these reasons, I veto SB 241.
