- (4)(d) "Gross household income" means all income received by all individuals of a household while they are members of the household.
- (5)(e) "Gross rent" means the total rent in cash or its equivalent actually paid during the claim period by the renter or lessee for the right of occupancy of the homestead pursuant to an arm's-length transaction with the landlord.
 - (6)(f) "Homestead" means:
- (a)(i) a single-family dwelling or unit of a multiple-unit dwelling that is subject to property taxes in Montana and as much of the surrounding land, but not in excess of 1 acre, as is reasonably necessary for its use as a dwelling; or
- (b)(ii) a single-family dwelling or unit of a multiple-unit dwelling that is rented from a county or municipal housing authority as provided in Title 7, chapter 15.

- $\frac{7}{g}$ (a)(i) "Household" means an association of persons who live in the same dwelling, sharing its furnishings, facilities, accommodations, and expenses.
- $\frac{\text{(b)}(ii)}{\text{(ii)}}$ The term does not include bona fide lessees, tenants, or roomers and boarders on contract.
- (8)(h) "Household income" means the amount obtained by subtracting \$6,300 from gross household income.
- (9)(i) (a)(i) "Income" means, except as provided in subsection (9)(b) (1)(i)(ii), federal adjusted gross income, without regard to loss, as that quantity is defined in the Internal Revenue Code of the United States, plus all nontaxable income, including but not limited to:
- (i)(A) the amount of any pension or annuity, including Railroad Retirement Act benefits and veterans' disability benefits;
 - (ii)(B) the amount of capital gains excluded from adjusted gross income;
 - (iii)(C) alimony;
 - (iv)(D) support money;
 - (v)(E) nontaxable strike benefits;
 - (vi)(F) cash public assistance and relief;
 - (vii)(G) interest on federal, state, county, and municipal bonds; and
- (viii)(H) all payments received under federal social security except social security income paid directly to a nursing home.
- (b)(ii) For the purposes of this subsection (9) (1)(i), income is reduced by the taxpayer's basis.
- (10)(j) "Property tax billed" means taxes levied against the homestead, including special assessments and fees but excluding penalties or interest during the claim period.
 - (11)(k) "Rent-equivalent tax paid" means 15% of the gross rent.
- (2) This tax credit is subject to termination on December 31, 2017, and every 8 years thereafter as provided in [section 1]."

Insert: "Section 9. Section 15-30-2338, MCA, is amended to read:

- "15-30-2338. Residential property tax credit for elderly -- eligibility -- disallowance or adjustment. (1) In order to be eligible to make a claim under 15-30-2337 through 15-30-2341, an individual:
 - (a) must have reached age 62 or older during the claim period for which relief is sought;
 - (b) must have resided in Montana for at least 9 months of that period;
- (c) must have occupied one or more dwellings in Montana as an owner, renter, or lessee for at least 6 months of the claim period; and
 - (d) must have less than \$45,000 of gross household income.
- (2) A person is not disqualified as a claimant if the person changes residences during the claim period, provided that the person occupies one or more dwellings in Montana as an owner, renter, or lessee for at least 6 months during the claim period.
- (3) A claim is disallowed if the department finds that the claimant received title to the claimant's homestead primarily for the purpose of receiving benefits under 15-30-2337 through 15-30-2341.
- (4) When the landlord and tenant have not dealt at arm's length and the department judges the gross rent charged to be excessive, the department may adjust the gross rent to a reasonable amount.
 - (5) This tax credit is subject to termination on December 31, 2017, and every 8 years

thereafter as provided in [section 1].""

- "15-30-2339. Residential property tax credit for elderly -- filing date. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3), a claim for relief must be submitted at the same time the claimant's individual income tax return is due. For an individual not required to file a tax return, the claim must be submitted on or before April 15 of the year following the year for which relief is sought.
- (2) A receipt showing property tax billed or a receipt showing gross rent paid, whichever is appropriate, must be filed with each claim. In addition, each claimant shall, at the request of the department, supply all additional information necessary to support a claim.
- (3) The department may grant a reasonable extension for filing a claim whenever, in its judgment, good cause exists.
