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12	Section 1. Section 69-3-303, MCA, is amended to read:
13	"69-3-303. Notice and hearing on proposed change. (1) (a) Except as provided in <u>69-3-304.</u> 69-3-308
14	and, OR subsection (1)(c) of this section, before the commission may approve approves any change increasing
15	the rate or rates for utility service in a schedule generally affecting consumers in a utility's service area or before
16	any change may become becomes effective due to the passage of 9 months, the commission shall publish a
17	notice of the proposed change, conforming to the requirements of 2-4-601 in one or more newspapers published
18	and of general circulation within the area affected by the proposed change.
19	(b) This The notice must announce a an opportunity for hearing on the proposed change and must inform
20	interested persons as to how they may petition the commission to become parties to the hearing.
21	(c) If the commission or the A utility requesting a change to GENERAL increase a rate or IN rates for service
22	sends written notice OF THE PROPOSED CHANGE directly to each THE affected customer CUSTOMERS, publication
23	in one or more newspapers within the area affected by the proposed change is not required.
24	(2) The If the commission proceeds to a hearing, it shall proceed to issue notice conforming to the
25	requirements of 2-4-601 and conduct the hearing under the Montana Administrative Procedure Act. The final
26	decision of the commission in any matter decided after a hearing conducted pursuant to this section must conform
27	to the requirements of a decision in a contested case under the Montana Administrative Procedure Act.
28	(3) The consumer counsel may petition to become a party to the hearing."
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
