14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE	OF THE STATE OF MOI	NTANA:
15			
16	Section 1. Section 20-7-1201, M	CA, is amended to read:	
17	"20-7-1201. Montana digital academy purposes governance. (1) There is a Montana digital		
18	academy at a unit of the Montana university system.		
19	(2) The purposes of the Montana	digital academy are to:	
20	(a) make distance learning oppo	ortunities available to all	school-age children through public school
21	districts in the state of Montana;		
22	(b) offer high-quality instructors	who are licensed and end	lorsed in Montana and courses that are in
23	compliance with all relevant education and	d distance learning rules,	standards, and policies; AND and
24	(c) emphasize the core subject i	matters required under th	e accreditation standards, offer advanced
25	courses for dual credit in collaboration with	h the Montana university s	system, and offer enrichment courses ; and
26	(d) offer courses that allow a student to meet the minimum graduation requirements established in the		
27	accreditation standards and enact enrollment policies allowing a student to pursue the student's high school		
28	diploma through online distance learning.		
29	(3) The Montana digital academy must be governed by a board with equal representation from:		
30	(a) the commissioner of higher ed	ducation or a designee;	
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1	(b) the superintendent of public instruction or a designee;		
2	(c) a Montana-licensed and Montana-endorsed classroom teacher appointed by the board of public		
3	education;		
4	(d) a Montana-licensed school district administrator appointed by the board of public education;		
5	(e) a trustee of a Montana school district appointed by the board of public education;		
6	(f) the dean of the school of education of the hosting unit of the Montana university system or a designee		
7	as a nonvoting member; and		
8	(g) the two officers provided for in subsection (5) as nonvoting members.		
9	(4) The governing board shall elect a presiding officer and vice presiding officer to 2-year terms without		
10	limitation on the number of terms.		
11	(5) The governing board shall hire a program director and a curriculum director who shall serve as chief		
12	executive officer and vice chief executive officer respectively on the governing board in a nonvoting capacity. The		
13	program director shall develop and, upon approval of the governing board, implement and publish policies and		
14	guidelines for the Montana digital academy pertaining to:		
15	(a) course offerings;		
16	(b) software and hardware selection;		
17	(c) instructor selection;		
18	(d) partnering school agreements;		
19	(e) instructor training and curriculum development;		
20	(f) course evaluation;		
21	(g) grant opportunities; and		
22	(h) other activities that are essential to the success of a statewide distance learning program."

24	<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Funding teacher compensation <u>RULEMAKING AUTHORITY</u> . (1) (A) In		
25	addition to any amount appropriated to the Montana digital academy by the legislature, beginning July 1, 2016,		
26	school districts enrolling students at the digital academy shall pay to the digital academy:		
27	(a) for each original credit course a fee equal to the per-ANB entitlement for a student divided by 16 then		
28	multiplied by:		
29	(i) 0.85 0.2 per student per course for a student's first three courses within a school fiscal year; and		
30	(ii) 0.70 0.1 per student per course for a student's fourth course and any additional courses taken by the		
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1	student within a school fiscal year;
2	(b) for each credit recovery course a fee equal to the per-ANB entitlement for a student divided by 16
3	then multiplied by 0.5 0.2 per student per course. ANY SUPPLEMENTAL FEE ESTABLISHED BY THE DIGITAL ACADEMY
4	THAT IS REQUIRED TO PAY FOR THE PRORATED COSTS OF COURSE DELIVERY THAT EXCEED THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED
5	TO THE DIGITAL ACADEMY BY THE LEGISLATURE. THE FEE MUST BE ESTABLISHED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE
6	DIGITAL ACADEMY BY RULE AND MUST BE COMMENSURATE WITH THE COSTS OF OPERATING THE DIGITAL ACADEMY THAT
7	EXCEED THE APPROPRIATION PROVIDED BY THE LEGISLATURE.
8	(B) FEES COLLECTED UNDER SUBSECTION (1)(A) MAY BE SPENT ONLY ON THE OPERATING COSTS OF THE DIGITAL
9	ACADEMY.
10	(C) THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE DIGITAL ACADEMY SHALL ADOPT RULES REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT
11	OF ANY FEES REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (1)(A).
12	(2) A SCHOOL DISTRICT IS PROHIBITED FROM CHARGING A FEE TO A STUDENT WHO ENROLLS IN A CLASS
13	PROVIDED BY THE MONTANA DIGITAL ACADEMY THAT THE SCHOOL DISTRICT REQUIRES FOR GRADUATION.
14	(2)(3) For the purposes of the calculations in subsection (1), the per-ANB entitlement is the amount for
15	either the 800th or 1,000th ANB for a particular student pursuant to 20-9-306(15).
16	(3)(4) The program director of the Montana digital academy shall implement policies for teacher
17	compensation with minimum compensation amounts as follows:
18	(a) for original credit courses, \$500 per course plus \$150 <u>\$120</u> for every student enrolled; and
19	(b) for credit recovery courses, \$3,000 per course to supervise no more than 100 students at any time.
20	
21	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Enrollment. The Montana digital academy may not limit the number of
22	students it enrolls or the number of courses students are allowed to enroll in.
23	
24	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Sections 2 and 3] are [Section 2] is intended
25	to be codified as an integral part of Title 20, chapter 7, part 12, and the provisions of Title 20, chapter 7, part 12,
26	apply to [sections 2 and 3] [SECTION 2].
27	
28	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2015.
