4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND
5	HUMAN SERVICES TO TAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS TO IMPROVE SERVICES TO PROTECT CHILDREN FROM
6	ABUSE AND NEGLECT; REQUIRING REPORTS; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AND PROVIDING AN
7	EFFECTIVE DATE."

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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11	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Duties of department staffing additional services reports. The
12	department shall:
13	(1) obtain from a national independent accreditation entity an estimate of the cost of achieving
14	accreditation for child and family services and an initial accreditation assessment of child and family services
15	provided by the department;
16	(2)(1) establish caseload standards for child welfare <del>and licensing</del> employees and maintain staffing levels
17	that meet national standards REASONABLE CASELOAD STANDARDS TO COMPLY WITH NATIONAL AND STATE
18	REQUIREMENTS;
19	(3) fund family preservation services, parent-child visitation services, foster care services, and
20	postpermanency support services;
21	(4) examine and, where appropriate, restructure rates in order to incentivize interventions and services
22	that are proven effective in preventing and treating child abuse and neglect;
23	(2) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT PUBLIC-PRIVATE PILOT PROGRAMS IN WHICH LICENSED PRIVATE CHILD-PLACING
24	AGENCIES OVERSEE THE LICENSURE, TRAINING, AND SUPPORT FOR FAMILY FOSTER CARE;
25	(5)(3) coordinate with county health departments to establish and maintain high-quality, in-home
26	partnerships between public health nurses and families;
27	(6) implement an electronic records management system and an integrated, automated case
28	management system in order to:
29	(a) ensure that information is available statewide;
30	(b) enhance protections for children; and



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1	(c) protect the privacy rights of persons whose information is part of the child welfare system case

3	(7)(4) report annually to the governor <del>and</del> , THE attorney general, AND THE CHILDREN, FAMILIES, HEALTH, AND
4	HUMAN SERVICES INTERIM COMMITTEE and biennially to the legislature. The report must provide information
5	regarding:
6	(a) the department's compliance with this section; and
7	(b) the safety, permanency, and well-being outcomes for children and families served by the child welfare
8	system; AND
9	(C) THE OUTCOMES OF THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE PILOT PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2).
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11	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation authorization. (1) There is appropriated \$3 million \$1
12	MILLION from the general fund to the department of public health and human services for the biennium beginning
13	July 1, 2015 <del>, and there is appropriated \$1.35 million in federal spending authority for the biennium beginning July</del>
14	<del>1, 2015</del> .
15	(2) The appropriation must be used to pay for the purposes established in [section 1] UP TO 27 FULL-TIME
16	EQUIVALENT FIELD STAFF POSITIONS IN THE CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES DIVISION, INCLUDING STAFF IN THE CENTRALIZED
17	INTAKE UNIT.
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19	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Legislative intent. The total amount of general fund expenditures made
20	in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, for the purposes provided in [section 1(2), (3), and (5)] may be:
21	(1) included in the proposed base budget for the 2019 biennium; and
22	(2) considered ongoing and included in the base budget proposed by the executive in future bienniums.
23	THE APPROPRIATION PROVIDED FOR IN [SECTION 2] IS:
24	(1) A ONE-TIME-ONLY APPROPRIATION; AND
25	(2) TO BE USED FOR FIELD STAFF IN THE CENTRALIZED INTAKE UNIT IN HELENA AND IN BILLINGS, BOZEMAN,
26	BUTTE, CONRAD, GLASGOW, GREAT FALLS, HAVRE, HELENA, AND MISSOULA.
27	
28	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
29	integral part of Title 52, chapter 2, part 1, and the provisions of Title 52, chapter 2, part 1, apply to [section 1].
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1	COORDINATION SECTION. Section 5. Coordination instruction. If BOTH HOUSE BILL NO. 2 AND [THIS
2	ACT] ARE PASSED AND APPROVED AND HOUSE BILL No. 2 CONTAINS A GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION FOR THE
3	GOVERNOR'S OFFICE, THEN THE HOUSE BILL NO. 2 GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION FOR THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE MUST
4	BE REDUCED BY \$500,000.

6	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2015.
