6	FROM ALL POLITICAL COMMITTEES FOR CANDIDATES FOR THE STATE SENATE AND THE STATE
7	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES; AMENDING THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX ADJUSTMENT FOR CERTAIN
8	MONETARY CONTRIBUTION ALLOWANCES; AMENDING SECTION 13-37-218, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN
9	EFFECTIVE DATE."
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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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13	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Sanctions for frivolous complaints. (1) By submitting a complaint to the
14	commissioner, the party submitting the complaint certifies that to the best of the person's knowledge, information,
15	and belief, formed after an inquiry reasonable under the circumstances:
16	(a) the complaint is not being presented for any improper purpose, including but not limited to
17	harassment;
18	(b) the claims are warranted under existing law or rule or by a nonfrivolous argument interpreting existing
19	law;
20	(c) the factual contentions have evidentiary support or will likely have evidentiary support after a
21	reasonable opportunity for further investigation or discovery.
22	(2) If, after notice and a reasonable opportunity to respond, the commissioner determines that subsection
23	(1) has been violated, the commissioner may impose a sanction on the party submitting the complaint that
24	violated subsection (1) or the party that is responsible for the violation.
25	(3) The commissioner may impose a fine of \$250 or the reasonable cost of attorney fees and staff time
26	in responding to and investigating the matter, whichever is greater.
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28	Section 2. Section 13-37-218, MCA, is amended to read:
29	"13-37-218. Limitations on receipts from political committees. A candidate for the state senate may
30	receive no more than \$2,150 \$5,500 in total combined monetary contributions from all political committees

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1 contributing to the candidate's campaign, and a candidate for the state house of representatives may receive no 2 more than \$1,300 \$3,300 in total combined monetary contributions from all political committees contributing to 3 the candidate's campaign. The limitations in this section must be multiplied by an inflation factor, which is 4 determined by dividing the consumer price index for June of the year prior to the year in which a general election 5 is held by the consumer price index for June 2003 2015. The resulting figure must be rounded up or down to the 6 nearest \$50 increment. The commissioner shall publish the revised limitations as a rule. In-kind contributions 7 must be included in computing these limitation totals. The limitation provided in this section does not apply to 8 contributions made by a political party eligible for a primary election under 13-10-601." 9 10 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction.
