8	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN EASTERN MONTANA LABORATORY OF
9	CRIMINALISTICS IN YELLOWSTONE COUNTY; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR CONSTRUCTION
10	LEASING OF THE LABORATORY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."
11	
12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
13	
14	Section 1. Section 44-3-301, MCA, is amended to read:
15	"44-3-301. Laboratory of criminalistics. (1) There is a laboratory of criminalistics within the department
16	of justice. The laboratory's purpose is to perform analysis of specimens submitted by all Montana state, county
17	or city law enforcement officers and all state agencies and referral specimens from other states if accepted by
18	the laboratory director.
19	(2) The laboratory's functions include analysis of toxicologic and criminalistic specimens which the
20	laboratory director considers within the performance capability of the laboratory.
21	(3) The laboratory must have a western Montana branch located in Missoula County and an eastern
22	Montana branch in Yellowstone County SHALL ESTABLISH A YELLOWSTONE COUNTY BRANCH. Each branch must be
23	capable of performing all purposes, duties, and functions required by this part. THE LABORATORY DIRECTOR WILL
24	DETERMINE THE PURPOSES, DUTIES, AND FUNCTIONS OF EACH BRANCH THE YELLOWSTONE COUNTY BRANCH, BUT
25	PRIORITY IS GIVEN TO THE RELIEF OF THE BACKLOGS OF CHEMISTRY AND TOXICOLOGY STATEWIDE."

27	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Transfer of funds. On July 1, 2015, the state treasurer shall transfer \$5.8
28	\$2.05 million from the general fund to the long-range building program account in the capital projects fund type
29	provided for in 17-7-205.

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1	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriations. (1) (a) There is appropriated \$5.8 \$2.05 million from the
2	long-range building program account to the department of administration for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015,
3	for the construction of an eastern Montana branch of the laboratory of criminalistics in Yellowstone County.
4	(b) If the department of administration determines that leasing facilities for the laboratory would be more
5	appropriate, the THE department is authorized to spend up to \$340,000 \$210,000 \$310,000 OF GENERAL FUND ONE
6	TIME ONLY to secure appropriate leased facilities for the biennium and the remainder of the appropriation in
7	subsection (1)(a) reverts to the general fund FOR THE YELLOWSTONE COUNTY BRANCH OF THE LABORATORY.
8	(2) There is appropriated \$1.8 million \$450,000 \$1.2 MILLION \$476,000 from the general fund ONE TIME
9	ONLY to the department of justice for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, to provide for personal services and
10	operating expenses, including training and initial operating expenses, of an eastern Montana branch of the
11	laboratory of criminalistics in Yellowstone County. Unspent funds revert to the general fund.
12	(3) THERE IS APPROPRIATED \$724,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND ONE TIME ONLY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
13	JUSTICE FOR THE BIENNIUM BEGINNING JULY 1, 2015, FOR EQUIPMENT FOR THE EASTERN MONTANA BRANCH OF THE
14	LABORATORY OF CRIMINALISTICS IN YELLOWSTONE COUNTY. UNSPENT FUNDS REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND.
15	
16	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Legislative consent. The appropriation contained in [section 3] constitutes
17	legislative consent for the construction of an eastern Montana branch of the laboratory of criminalistics in
18	Yellowstone County within the meaning of 18-2-102.

20	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2015.
