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11	Section 1. Section 20-1-401, MCA,	, is amended to read	l:	
12	"20-1-401. Disaster drills to be conducted regularly districts to identify disaster risks and adopt			
13	school safety plan. (1) As used in this part, "disaster" means the occurrence or imminent threat of damage,			
14	injury, or loss of life or property. Disaster drills must be conducted regularly in accordance with this part.			
15	(2) A board of trustees shall identify the local hazards that exist within the boundaries of its school distric			
16	and design and incorporate drills in its school safety plan or emergency operations plan to address those hazards.			
17	(3) A board of trustees shall adop	ot a school safety p	lan on or before July 1, 2014, <u>or emergency</u>	
18	operations plan that addresses issues of school safety relating to school buildings and facilities, communications			
19	systems, and school grounds with the input from the local community and that addresses coordination on issues			
20	of school safety, if any, with the county interdisciplinary child information and school safety team provided for in			
21	52-2-211. The trustees shall certify to the office of public instruction on or before July 1, 2014, that a school safety			
22	plan or emergency operations plan has been adopted. The trustees shall review the school safety plan or			
23	emergency operations plan periodically and update the plan as determined necessary by the trustees based on			
24	changing circumstances pertaining to school safety. Once the trustees have made the certification to the office			
25	of public instruction, the trustees may transfer funds pursuant to [section 2] to make improvements to school			
26	safety and security."

29	"Section 9. Transfer of funds improvements to school safety and security. (1) For fiscal year 2013			
30	through fiscal year 2015 only, a A school district may transfer state or local revenue from any budget

1	nonbudgeted fund, other than the debt service fund or retirement fund, to its building reserve fund in an amount		
2	not to exceed the school district's estimated costs of improvements to school safety and security as follows:		
3	(a) planning for improvements to school safety, including but not limited to the cost of services provided		
4	by architects, engineers, and other consultants;		
5	(b) installing or updating locking mechanisms and ingress and egress systems at public school access		
6	points, including but not limited to systems for exterior egress doors and interior passageways and rooms, using		
7	contemporary technologies;		
8	(c) installing or updating bullet-resistant windows and barriers; and		
9	(d) installing or updating emergency response systems using contemporary technologies.		
10	(2) Any transfers made pursuant to subsection (1) are not considered expenditures to be applied against		
11	budget authority. Any revenue transfers that are not encumbered for expenditures in compliance with subsection		
12	(1) by June 30, 2015 2019, must be transferred back to the originating fund from which the revenue was		
13	transferred.		
14	(3) The intent of this section is to increase the flexibility and efficiency of school districts without an		
15	increase in local taxes. In furtherance of this intent, if transfers of funds are made from any school district fund		
16	supported by a nonvoted levy, the district may not increase its nonvoted levy for the purpose of restoring the		
17	transferred funds."

19	Section 3. Section 12, Chapter 364, Laws of 2013, is amended to read:		
20	"Section 12. Termination. [Section 9] terminates June 30, 2015 2019."
