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8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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10	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Education and outreach for medicaid program. (1) To ensure that
11	individuals use the most appropriate medically necessary services and access medicaid benefits at the
12	appropriate place and time, the department shall provide information and ongoing education on medicaid benefits
13	and health care topics. The information and education must be provided in a culturally competent manner through
14	a combination of written and oral methods and using clear, nontechnical language.
15	(2) The department shall make the following resources available to individuals at the time they are
16	determined eligible for the medicaid program:
17	(a) a list of covered services grouped by type of services, including but not limited to recommended
18	preventive services, primary care services, specialist services, dental and vision services, and mental health
19	services;
20	(b) information about the scope and availability of early and periodic screening, diagnostic, and treatment
21	services available for individuals under the age of 21;
22	(c) a list of services that are not covered by the medicaid program;
23	(d) information on how to view the comprehensive medicaid manual online and how to request a hard
24	copy of the manual;
25	(e) the telephone number of the medicaid help line; and
26	(f) the telephone number of any free medical advice line provided by the medicaid program.
27	(3) The department shall hold informational sessions at least quarterly at local offices of public
28	assistance or other locations that are easily accessible and centrally located.
29	(4) The department shall publish a newsletter at least twice a year to provide individuals covered by
30	medicaid with information on changes in the medicaid program, on using medicaid benefits in the most

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1 appropriate manner, on wellness topics, and on other health topics determined by the department to be 2 appropriate for dissemination.

- (5) (a) The department shall provide an explanation of benefits for medicaid-covered services at least once a month to:
 - (i) the individual to whom health care services were provided; or
- 6 (ii) if the individual is a child, the parent, legal guardian, or specified caretaker relative of the child.
 - (b) The explanation of benefits must clearly note that the statement is not a bill and is only a description of the services and the cost of the services that the individual received.
 - (6) The department shall provide eligibility technicians and caseworkers with copies of all informational materials developed under this section and other educational materials as necessary.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53, chapter 6, part 1, and the provisions of Title 53, chapter 6, part 1, apply to [section 1].

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
