18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

22	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Constituent services STIPEND AND reimbursement. (1) EACH LEGISLATOR
23	IS ENTITLED TO A STIPEND OF \$3,000 IN A BIENNIUM FOR PROVIDING CONSTITUENT SERVICES, WHICH INCLUDE BUT ARE
24	NOT LIMITED TO UNREIMBURSED EXPENSES FOR MILEAGE, PER DIEM, OR LODGING AS WELL AS COMMUNICATION AND
25	INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, SUCH AS EXPENSES FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS OR INTERNET, COMPUTER HARDWARE AND
26	SOFTWARE, POSTAGE, AND EDUCATION-RELATED EXPENSES TO REPRESENT CONSTITUENTS.
27	(1)(2) Subject to subsection (3) SUBSECTIONS (4) AND (5), legislators are allowed reimbursement of up
28	to \$3,000 THE AMOUNT PROVIDED FOR IN SUBSECTION (3) in a biennium for:
29	(a) otherwise unreimbursed expenses related to the legislator's expenses for mileage, meals, or lodging
30	at rates provided for in 2-18-501 through 2-18-503 incurred for providing constituent services; and



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1	(b) communication and information technology expenses, such as expenses for telecommunications or
2	internet, computer hardware and software, postage, and education-related expenses to represent and serve
3	constituents.
4	(3) THE AMOUNT AUTHORIZED UNDER SUBSECTION (2) IS:
5	(A) \$1,000 IF THE LEGISLATOR'S DISTRICT IS AT LEAST 100 SQUARE MILES BUT LESS THAN 1,000 SQUARE MILES;
6	(B) \$2,000 IF THE LEGISLATOR'S DISTRICT IS AT LEAST 1,000 SQUARE MILES BUT LESS THAN 5,000 SQUARE
7	MILES;
8	(C) \$3,000 IF THE LEGISLATOR'S DISTRICT IS AT LEAST 5,000 SQUARE MILES BUT LESS THAN 7,500 SQUARE
9	MILES; OR
10	(D) \$4,000 IF THE LEGISLATOR'S DISTRICT IS 7,500 SQUARE MILES OR MORE.
11	(2)(4) Legislators must For expenses authorized under subsection (2), a legislator shall apply for
12	reimbursement to the legislative services division and must submit: BY SUBMITTING
13	(a) written documentation that satisfies applicable requirements of Title 2, chapter 18, part 5 , for
14	expenses provided in subsection (1)(a); and
15	(b) itemized receipts for the expenses provided in subsection (1)(b).
16	(3)(5) Legislators may not be reimbursed for expenses paid from a constituent services account provided
17	for in 13-37-402.

19	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
20	integral part of Title 5, chapter 2, part 2, and the provisions of Title 5, chapter 2, part 2, apply to [section 1].
