SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 25

2	INTRODUCED BY C. SMITH
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4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA REQUESTING AN INTERIM STUDY OF THE USE OF A PATIENT COMPENSATION SYSTEM AS
6	AN EXCLUSIVE REMEDY FOR INJURIES CAUSED BY MEDICAL CARE; AND REQUIRING THAT THE FINAL
7	RESULTS OF THE STUDY BE REPORTED TO THE 65TH LEGISLATURE.
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9	WHEREAS, the lack of legal representation and, thus, compensation for the majority of patients with
10	legitimate medical injuries is creating a crisis in accessing courts; and
11	WHEREAS, seeking compensation through medical malpractice litigation is a costly and protracted
12	process, resulting in legal counsel being able to afford to finance only a small number of legitimate claims; and
13	WHEREAS, even for patients who are able to obtain legal representation, the delay in obtaining
14	compensation averages 5 years, creating a significant hardship for patients and their caregivers who often need
15	access to immediate care and compensation; and
16	WHEREAS, because of continued exposure to liability, an overwhelming majority of physicians practice
17	defensive medicine by ordering unnecessary tests and procedures, increasing the cost of health care for
18	individuals covered by public and private health insurance coverage and exposing patients to unnecessary clinical
19	risks; and
20	WHEREAS, recruiting physicians to practice in this state and ensuring that current physicians continue
21	to practice in this state are overwhelming public necessities.
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23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
24	STATE OF MONTANA:
25	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee, pursuant to
26	section 5-5-217, MCA, to study the use of a patient compensation system as an exclusive remedy for claims for
27	injury or death related to medical care provided by health care providers and health care facilities.
28	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the study:
29	(1) review Montana's existing system for handling claims involving medical malpractice, including bu
30	not limited to the use and results of the review process established under the Montana Medical Legal Panel Ac

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(2) review proposals and related research for patient compensation systems under consideration in other
 states;

- (3) determine to the extent possible whether a patient compensation system would reduce the number of medical malpractice claims and the practice of defensive medicine;
- (4) identify any statutory or constitutional barriers to establishing a patient compensation system and propose potential solutions for overcoming any barriers that are identified;
- (5) consider the optimal structure for a patient compensation system, including but not limited to the review, payment, and appeals processes for claims made under the system; and
- (6) identify potential funding sources for a patient compensation system, including but not limited to fees to be paid by health care providers who participate in the system.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the study include participation by health care providers, attorneys, medical malpractice insurers, relevant state agencies, and other interested parties identified by the committee.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2016.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions, comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee, be reported to the 65th Legislature.
- 18 <u>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</u>, THAT IF BOTH HOUSE BILL NO. 614 AND THIS RESOLUTION ARE PASSED AND

 19 APPROVED, THEN THIS RESOLUTION IS VOID.
