9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	Section 1. Section 46-13-401, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"46-13-401. Dismissal at instance of court or prosecution. (1) The court may, either on its own
13	motion or upon the application of the prosecuting attorney and in furtherance of justice, order a complaint,
14	information, or indictment to be dismissed. However, the court may not order a dismissal of a complaint,
15	information, or indictment, or a count contained in a complaint, information, or indictment, charging a felony,
16	unless good cause for dismissal is shown and the reasons for the dismissal are set forth in an order entered upon
17	the minutes.
18	(2) After the entry of a plea upon a misdemeanor charge, the court, unless good cause to the contrary
19	is shown, shall order the prosecution to be dismissed, with prejudice, if a defendant whose trial has not been
20	postponed upon the defendant's motion is not brought to trial within 6 months.
21	(3) After an initial appearance or the entry of a plea on a charge for a felony offense, the court may
22	address a defendant's motion to dismiss for lack of a speedy trial only if the defendant demonstrates that 200
23	days have elapsed or will elapse from the date of the initial appearance or entry of a plea to the scheduled trial
24	date."
