10	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING A PUBLIC LANDS DAY TO BE RECOGNIZED ON THE
11	FIRST DAY OF MARCH."
12	
13	WHEREAS, Montana's wide boundaries include a bountiful collection of the most outstanding public lands
14	incomparable national parks, untouched wilderness areas, pristine rivers and streams, majestic forests, wide
15	open prairies, sagebrush landscapes, and wildlife refuges; and
16	WHEREAS, Montana recognizes that these public lands are part of our heritage and treasure; and
17	WHEREAS, Montana has the responsibility to safeguard these irreplaceable natural resources to ensure
18	their continued protection for future generations of residents and visitors; and
19	WHEREAS, Montana's outdoor recreation economy currently generates \$5.8 billion in consumer
20	spending, supporting 64,000 direct jobs and producing \$403 million in state and local tax revenue; and
21	WHEREAS, Montana has shown the ability to balance the values of recreation, preservation,
22	conservation, and economic productivity; and
23	WHEREAS, Montana has guaranteed our right to public access to our PUBLIC lands and streams,
24	reflecting our democratic ideals to equality while promoting good stewardship of our lands; and
25	WHEREAS, Montana contains our crown of the continent, Glacier National Park, and our first national
26	park, Yellowstone; and
27	WHEREAS, Montana values were born around a campfire at Madison Junction in 1870 when three men
28	realized that this jewel of the Yellowstone should be accessible in perpetuity and recognizing public ownership;

30	WHEREAS, Montana designates the first of March as Public Lands Day in honor of our first national park,

1	which was established on March 1, 1872.

3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
4	
5	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Public lands day. (1) To recognize the significant contributions that public
6	lands within Montana make to wildlife, recreation, the economy, and to Montanans' quality of life, March 1 is
7	designated as public lands day.
8	(2) Appropriate observation may be held by the public and in all public schools in tribute to the
9	importance of public lands in Montana.
10	(3) The governor shall issue a proclamation to call the public's attention to the importance of public lands
11	and to encourage celebration of public lands day.

13	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
14	integral part of Title 1, chapter 1, part 2, and the provisions of Title 1, chapter 1, part 2, apply to [section 1].
