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11	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Continuing training requirement. A deputy sheriff, undersheriff, or police		
12	officer must receive 3 hours of annual training on landlord and tenant law.		
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14	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Co	ontinuing education assist	tance to local governments landlord
15	tenant law. To assist local governments in fulfilling the requirements provided by [section 1], the Montana law		
16	enforcement academy may conduct professional development training, develop training materials, or assist local		
17	governments that are developing training materials or conducting training for officers who are required to		
18	participate in annual landlord and tenant	law training.

20	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated \$49,900 from the general fund to the		
21	department of justice for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, for the purpose of financing the cost of training		
22	pursuant to [section 1], including reimbursements to municipalities and counties conducting or attending training		
23	pursuant to [section 1] and developing the training and associated materials.

25	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Co	dification instruction. (1) [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
