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| 10 | NEW SECTION. Section 1. Monitoring of children's mental health outcomes report. (1) The                          |
| 11 | department shall monitor the status of children being served RECEIVING TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES         |
| 12 | in the state-funded children's mental health system each fiscal year to determine whether, after receiving       |
| 13 | services, the children are able to remain at home, in school, and out of trouble.                                |
| 14 | (2) The department shall monitor the following factors to determine whether children who have received           |
| 15 | mental health RECEIVING TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT services are able to return to or remain at home:               |
| 16 | (a) whether a child remained in the home while receiving services or returned to the home after receiving        |
| 17 | out-of-home services;  |
| 18 | (b) the number of children placed in out-of-home mental health treatment;  |
| 19 | (c) the number of children who were placed in or left a foster care or correctional setting; and                 |
| 20 | (d) the number and types of home and community-based services that children received.                            |
| 21 | (3) The department shall work with schools to monitor, to the extent possible, the following factors related     |
| 22 | to a child's success in the school success of a child receiving targeted case management services:               |
| 23 | (a) the number of children who did not return to or dropped out of school; and                                   |
| 24 | (b) the number of children who did not advance to the next grade level.  |
| 25 | (4) The department shall work with the juvenile justice system to monitor, to the extent possible, the           |
| 26 | following factors related to whether a child <u>RECEIVING TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES</u> has remained our |
| 27 | of trouble after receiving mental health services:   |
| 28 | (a) the number of children receiving treatment for substance use;  |
| 29 | (b) the number of children referred to youth court; and  |
| 30 | (c) the number of children who completed suicide.  |

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| 1  | (5) The department shall report annually to the children, families, health, and human services interim                   |
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| 2  | committee and to the legislature as provided in 5-11-210 on the information required under this section.                 |

| 5  | department of public health and human services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, to carry out the                 |
| 6  | purposes of [section 1].   |

| 9  | integral part of Title 53, chapter 21, part 5, and the provisions of Title 53, chapter 21, part 5, apply to [section 1]. |
