HOUSE JOURNAL 65TH LEGISLATURE FIFTEENTH LEGISLATIVE DAY

Helena, Montana January 20, 2017 House Chambers State Capitol

House convened at 1:00 p.m. Mr. Speaker presiding. Invocation by Representative Webb. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Roll Call. All members present, except Representatives Essmann, Fitzgerald, Kipp III, Lavin, Mr. Speaker, Swanson, Welch, excused. Quorum present.

Majority Leader Ehli addressed the House:

Today is a great day in America.

Today we as Americans inaugurated the 45th President of the United States. Today we saw the transition of power in the greatest Nation in the world in a peaceful way.

No matter what side of the political aisle you fall on, we can all agree that this peaceful transition of power and continuity of government in our Nation is one of the many things that make ours the greatest country in the world. We are a beacon of democracy and hope across the world.

As Mr. Trump spoke his first words to the Country as President Trump he said, "This moment is not only about transferring power from one party to another, it's about transferring power from Washington, D.C. to the people of this great Country."

As it is for America, today is a special and important day for Montana.

Agencies that have entered into agreements authorized by the laws of Montana to pay the state treasurer, for deposit in accordance with 17-2-101 through 17-2-107, as determined by the state treasurer, an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest as due on the bonds or notes have statutory appropriation authority for the payments.
