4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA REQUESTING AN INTERIM LEGISLATIVE STUDY OF METHAMPHETAMINE USE AND ILLEGAL
6	<u>USE OF OPIOIDS</u> IN MONTANA.

8	WHEREAS, law enforcement agencies are reporting an increase in the number of arrests involving
9	methamphetamine, with the state Division of Criminal Investigation reporting that it handled 232
10	methamphetamine cases in 2015, compared with 68 in 2010; and
11	WHEREAS, the increased use of methamphetamine in Montana is leading to corresponding increases
12	in law enforcement investigations, district court caseloads, jail and prison populations, and foster care
13	placements, as well as a growing need for treatment services; and
14	WHEREAS, the number of child abuse and neglect cases filed in district courts across Montana
15	increased from 1,006 in 2009 to 2,433 in 2016, with officials attributing much of the increase to methamphetamine and the contraction of the contra
16	use by parents; and
17	WHEREAS, the Protect Montana Kids Commission report to the Governor in May 2016 noted that more
18	than 1,000 of the 3,000 children in foster care in 2015 were placed in foster care because of methamphetamine
19	use by their parents AND THAT OPIOID ADDICTION AND ILLEGAL DRUG USE ARE FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO CHILDREN
20	EXPERIENCING CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT; and
21	WHEREAS, state and local agencies are struggling to deal with the increased demand for services due
22	to methamphetamine use; and
23	WHEREAS, methamphetamine use has an unquantifiable effect on the physical, mental, and social
24	well-being of not only methamphetamine users but also their family members.
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26	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
27	STATE OF MONTANA:
28	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee <u>OR COMMITTEES</u> ,
29	pursuant to section 5-5-217, MCA, to review:
30	(1) the extent of methamphetamine use AND ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS in Montana;

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(2) the degree to which methamphetamine use <u>AND ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS</u> has affected services provided by law enforcement, the judiciary, state and local government agencies, and programs that work with individuals involved with methamphetamine use <u>OR ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS</u> or family members impacted by use of the <u>drug DRUGS</u>;

- (3) the treatment available for methamphetamine use <u>OR ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS</u>, including how the course of treatment and availability of treatment affects an individual's ability to be reunified with children who have been removed from the home; and
- (4) the efforts being undertaken by law enforcement, the judiciary, and state and local governments to reduce methamphetamine use <u>AND ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS</u> and mitigate its impact <u>THEIR IMPACTS</u> on Montanans and on state and local government agencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee OR COMMITTEES develop recommendations for:

- (1) reducing methamphetamine use <u>AND ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS</u>, including prevention and treatment efforts:
- (2) mitigating the impacts of methamphetamine use <u>AND ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS</u> on Montanans and their families: and
- (3) improving collaboration and cooperation among state and local government agencies in addressing methamphetamine use AND ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS and its THEIR impacts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the study include representatives of the Department of Public Health and Human Services, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Justice, the Office of State Public Defender, district court judges, county attorneys, local law enforcement agencies, local government, and drug treatment programs and other entities that offer services to individuals involved with or impacted by the use of methamphetamine OR THE ILLEGAL USE OF OPIOIDS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2018.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions, comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee <u>OR COMMITTEES</u>, be reported to the 66th Legislature.
