4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA EMPHASIZING THE VALUE OF PUBLIC LANDS IN MONTANA TO THE STATE'S ECONOMY
6	RECREATION, HERITAGE, AND QUALITY OF LIFE; AND OPPOSING ANY EFFORT TO CLAIM, TAKE OVER
7	CONVEY, OR SELL OFF FEDERAL LANDS WITHIN THE STATE OF MONTANA.

9	WHEREAS, Montana has some of the most beautiful landscapes on earth, including mountains, rivers
10	forests, foothills, prairies, sagebrush steppes, and badlands, and many of those places are found on federal
11	public lands; and
12	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands consist of national parks, wildlife refuges, wilderness areas
13	Indian reservations, national monuments, national forests, historic sites, recreation areas, and wild and scenic
14	rivers, which constitute more than 28% of the land in Montana; and
15	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands are managed for multiple uses, including timber, range, water
16	recreation, and wildlife, and provide Montanans with opportunities to engage in land management planning; and
17	WHEREAS, access to these federal public lands is essential to the quality of life in Montana, providing
18	all Montanans with world-class opportunities for hunting and angling, hiking, backpacking, snowmobiling, riding
19	all-terrain vehicles, wildlife watching, skiing, cycling, sightseeing, and numerous other recreational activities; and
20	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands are incredibly rich in wildlife, are essential for the preservation
21	of our native fish and wildlife, and provide some of the best hunting and angling opportunities in the world; and
22	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands provide important resources for the timber industry; and
23	WHEREAS, Montana's agricultural industry includes numerous ranchers who depend on grazing federa
24	public lands to sustain their operations; and
25	WHEREAS, Montana's diverse communities rely on clean and reliable sources of water that originate
26	on federal public lands; and
27	WHEREAS, federal public lands contribute significantly to Montana's tourism and outdoor recreation
28	economies, creating jobs and generating important tax revenue throughout the state; and
29	WHEREAS, Montana business owners consistently cite the appeal of outdoor recreation on Montana's
30	federal public lands as a major draw to establish new businesses and recruit employees; and
