4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SUPPLEMENTAL FEEDING OF WILD

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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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9	Section 1. Section 87-6-216, MCA, is amended to read:
10	"87-6-216. Unlawful supplemental feeding. (1) A person may not provide supplemental feed
11	attractants to game animals or wild turkeys by:
12	(a) purposely or knowingly attracting any cloven-hoofed ungulates, bears, or mountain lions, or wild
13	turkeys with supplemental feed attractants;
14	(b) after having received a previous warning, negligently failing to properly store supplemental feed
15	attractants and allowing any cloven-hoofed ungulates, bears, or mountain lions, or wild turkeys access to the
16	supplemental feed attractants; or
17	(c) purposely or knowingly providing supplemental feed attractants in a manner that results in an artificial
18	concentration of game animals or wild turkeys that may potentially contribute to the transmission of disease or
19	that constitutes a threat to public safety.
20	(2) A person is not subject to civil or criminal liability under this section if the person is engaged in:
21	(a) the normal feeding of livestock;
22	(b) a normal agricultural practice;
23	(c) cultivation of a lawn or garden;
24	(d) the commercial processing of garbage; or
25	(e) recreational feeding of birds unless, after having received a previous warning by the department, the
26	person continues to feed birds in a manner that attracts cloven-hoofed ungulates, or bears, or wild turkeys and
27	that may contribute to the transmission of disease or constitute a threat to public safety.
28	(3) This section does not apply to supplemental feeding activities conducted by the department for
29	disease control purposes.
30	(4) A person convicted of a violation of this section shall be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$1,000

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1 or be imprisoned in the county detention center for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person, upon

- 2 conviction or forfeiture of bond or bail, may be subject to forfeiture of any current hunting, fishing, or trapping
- 3 license issued by this state and the privilege to hunt, fish, or trap in this state or to use state lands, as defined in

4 77-1-101, for recreational purposes for a period of time set by the court."
