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9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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11	Section 1. Section 2-2-106, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"2-2-106. Disclosure. (1) (a) Prior to December 15 of each even-numbered year, each state officer,
13	holdover senator, supreme court justice, and district court judge director of the executive branch of state
14	government shall file with the commissioner of political practices a business disclosure statement on a form
15	provided by the commissioner. An individual filing pursuant to subsection (1)(b) or (1)(c) is not required to file
16	under this subsection (1)(a) during the same period.
17	(b) Each candidate for a statewide or a state office elected from a district shall, within 5 days of the time
18	that the candidate files for office, file a business disclosure statement with the commissioner of political practices
19	on a form provided by the commissioner.
20	(c) An individual appointed to office who would be required to file under subsection (1)(a) or (1)(b) is
21	required to file the business disclosure statement at the earlier of the time of submission of the person's name
22	for confirmation or the assumption of the office.
23	(2) The statement must provide the following information:
24	(a) the name, address, and type of business of the individual;
25	(b) each present or past employing entity from which benefits, including retirement benefits, are currently
26	received by the individual;
27	(c) each business, firm, corporation, partnership, and other business or professional entity or trust in
28	which the individual holds an interest;
29	(d) each entity not listed under subsections (2)(a) through (2)(c) in which the individual is an officer or
30	director, regardless of whether or not the entity is organized for profit; and

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	(e)	all real property	, other than	a personal	residence,	in which	the i	ndividual	holds an	interest.	Real

- (3) An individual may not assume or continue to exercise the powers and duties of the office to which that individual has been elected or appointed until the statement has been filed as provided in subsection (1).
- (4) The commissioner of political practices shall make the business disclosure statements available to any individual upon request."

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
