9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Tribal regalia and objects of cultural significance allowed at public
12	events. (1) The purpose of this section is to help further the state's recognition of the distinct and unique cultural
13	heritage of the American Indians and the state's commitment to preserving the American Indians' cultural integrity
14	as provided in Article X, section 1(2), of the Montana constitution.
15	(2) A state agency or a local government may not prohibit an individual from wearing traditional tribal
16	regalia or objects of cultural significance at a public event.
17	(3) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
18	(a) "Individual" means a human being regardless of age.
19	(b) "Local government" has the meaning provided in 2-2-102.
20	(c) "Public event" means an event held or sponsored by a state agency or a local government, including
21	but not limited to an award ceremony, a graduation ceremony, or a public meeting.
22	(d) "State agency" has the meaning provided in 1-2-116.
23	
24	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send a
25	copy of [this act] to each tribal government located on the seven Montana reservations and to the Little Shell
26	Chippewa tribe.
27	
28	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
29	integral part of Title 2, and the provisions of Title 2 apply to [section 1].
