4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE EXPUNGEMENT OF CRIMINAL RECORDS
5	FOR MISDEMEANOR OFFENSES IN CERTAIN CASES; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS; AND PROVIDING
6	RULEMAKING AUTHORITY."

8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Expungement of misdemeanor records petition to district court
11	criteria for expungement DEFINITIONS. (1) A person convicted of a misdemeanor offense who has completed
12	the terms of the sentence for the misdemeanor offense may petition the district court for an order requiring the
13	expungement of all records of the arrest, investigation, and detention, if any, and any court proceedings that may
14	have been held in the case.
15	(2) Unless the interests of public safety demand otherwise, the district court shall order the records
16	expunged if:
17	(a) (I) the person has not been convicted of any other offense in this state, another state, or federal court
18	for a period of 5 years since the person completed the terms of the original sentence for the offense, including
19	payment of any financial obligations or successful completion of court-ordered treatment; and OR
20	(II) THE PERSON HAS APPLIED TO A UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY, HAS APPLIED TO ENLIST IN THE ARMED
21	FORCES OR NATIONAL GUARD, OR IS CURRENTLY SERVING IN THE ARMED FORCES OR NATIONAL GUARD AND IS PROHIBITED
22	FROM ENLISTING OR HOLDING A CERTAIN POSITION DUE TO A PRIOR CONVICTION; AND
23	(b) the person is not currently being detained for the commission of a new offense and has not been
24	charged with the commission of a new offense.
25	(3) Expungement may not be presumed if the person seeking expungement has two ONE or more
26	convictions for assault under 45-5-201 or, partner or family member assault under 45-5-206, STALKING UNDER
27	45-5-220, A VIOLATION OF A PROTECTIVE ORDER UNDER 45-5-626, OR DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR
28	DRUGS UNDER TITLE 61, CHAPTER 8, PART 4.
29	(4) If the order of expungement is granted, a copy of the order must be sent BY THE PERSON WHOSE
30	RECORDS ARE TO BE EXPUNGED to the arresting law enforcement agency, the prosecutor's office that prosecuted
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1	the offense, THE CLERK OF THE COURT IN WHICH THE PERSON WAS SENTENCED, and the department of justice, along
2	with a form prepared by the department of justice that contains identifying information about the petitioner.
3	(5) After the records are expunged, all records and data relating to the charge are confidential criminal
4	justice information as defined in 44-5-103, and public access to the information may be obtained only by district
5	court order upon good cause shown.
6	(6)(5) For purposes of handling expunged records, the department of justice may adopt rules to
7	implement the provisions of this section.
8	(7)(6) A person's records may be expunged pursuant to this section no more than one time during the
9	person's life. A PERSON SUBMITTING A PETITION FOR EXPUNGEMENT UNDER THIS SECTION MUST BE FINGERPRINTED FOR
10	PURPOSES OF DETERMINING PRIOR CONVICTIONS.
11	(7) THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE SHALL EXPUNGE ANY RECORDS UNDER THIS SECTION WITHIN EXISTING
12	DEPARTMENT RESOURCES.
13	(8) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS APPLY:
14	(A) "EXPUNGE" OR "EXPUNGEMENT" MEANS TO PERMANENTLY DESTROY, DELETE, OR ERASE A RECORD OF AN
15	OFFENSE FROM THE CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION SYSTEM MAINTAINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE IN
16	A MANNER THAT IS APPROPRIATE FOR THE RECORD'S PHYSICAL OR ELECTRONIC FORM.
17	(B) (I) "RECORD" MEANS ANY IDENTIFIABLE DESCRIPTION, NOTATION, OR PHOTOGRAPH OF AN ARREST AND
18	DETENTION; COMPLAINT, INDICTMENT, OR INFORMATION AND DISPOSITION ARISING FROM A COMPLAINT, INDICTMENT, OR
19	INFORMATION; SENTENCE; CORRECTIONAL STATUS; RELEASE; AND COURT DOCUMENT OR FILING.
20	(II) THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE A FINGER PRINT RECORD OR DATA THAT MAY BE MAINTAINED FOR INVESTIGATIVE
21	PURPOSES.

23	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
24	integral part of Title 46, chapter 18, and the provisions of Title 46, chapter 18, apply to [section 1].
