5	MICRODISTILLERY AFTER THE STATUTORY TIME LIMIT FOR A DISTILLERY TO PROVIDE LIQUOR;
6	AMENDING SECTION 16-4-312, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE A DELAYED EFFECTIVE DATE AND
7	AN APPLICABILITY DATE."
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9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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11	Section 1. Section 16-4-312, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"16-4-312. Domestic distillery. (1) A distillery located in Montana and licensed pursuant to 16-4-311
13	may:
14	(a) import necessary products in bulk;
15	(b) bottle, produce, blend, store, transport, or export liquor that it produces;
16	(c) perform those operations that are permitted for bonded distillery premises under applicable
17	regulations of the United States department of the treasury.
18	(2) (a) A distillery that is located in Montana and licensed pursuant to 16-4-311 shall sell liquor to the
19	department under this code, and the department shall include the distillery's liquor as a listed product.
20	(b) The distillery may use a common carrier for delivery of the liquor to the department.
21	(c) A distillery that produces liquor within the state under this subsection (2) shall maintain records of
22	all sales and shipments. The distillery shall furnish monthly and other reports concerning quantities and prices
23	of liquor that it ships to the department and other information that the department may determine to be necessary
24	to ensure that distribution of liquor within this state conforms to the requirements of this code.
25	(3) A microdistillery may:
26	(a) provide, with or without charge, not more than 2 ounces of liquor that it produces at the microdistillery
27	to consumers for consumption on the premises between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. <u>Liquor that is provided to a customer</u>
28	by no later than 8 p.m. may be consumed on the premises until 9 p.m. A microdistillery may not sell or give more
29	than 2 ounces of liquor to an individual for on-premises consumption during a business day. LIQUOR PROVIDED
30	UNDER THIS SUBSECTION (3)(A) MUST CONTAIN AT LEAST 90% LIQUOR THAT IS DISTILLED ON THE PREMISES. FOR

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1	PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "DISTILLED ON THE PREMISES" MEANS THE LIQUOR WAS NOT PREVIOUSLY DISTILLED OF
2	PREMISES BY ANY ENTITY, IN ANY WAY, AND AT ANY TIME. THE TERM IS MEANT TO EXCLUDE DISTILLED LIQUOR PURCHASED
3	BY THE DISTILLER AND REDISTILLED OR OTHERWISE ALTERED BY THE DISTILLER ON PREMISES.
4	(b) sell liquor that it produces at retail at the distillery directly to the consumer for off-premises
5	consumption if:
6	(i) not more than 1.75 liters a day is sold to an individual; and
7	(ii) the minimum retail price as determined by the department is charged."
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9	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval JANUARY
10	<u>1, 2019</u> .
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12	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Applicability. [This act] applies to liquor that is provided to a customer or
13	or after [the effective date of this act].
