9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	Section 1. Section 16-4-411, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"16-4-411. Appeals concerning alcoholic beverages laws. (1) Any interested party has the right to
13	an administrative appeal of any decision of the department of revenue concerning the issuance, transfer,
14	suspension, or revocation of alcoholic beverages licenses. The appeal must be in conformity with the provisions
15	of Title 2, chapter 4.
16	(1)(2) (a) Any interested party shall have has the right to appeal any decision of the department of
17	revenue concerning the issuance, transfer, suspension, or revocation of alcoholic beverages licenses to the
18	district court in the county in which the issuance, transfer, suspension, or revocation occurred or, at the
19	appellant's option, in the district court of the first judicial district.
20	(2)(b) The appeal must be in conformity with the provisions of Title 2, chapter 4, part 7."

22	Section 2. Section 16-4-412, MCA, is amended to read:
23	"16-4-412. Limits on concurrent applications. (1) An application for the issuance of a new license or
24	for the transfer of an existing license may not be considered by the department if a previous application for the
25	same premises license is pending. An application is considered pending if a final decision:
26	(a) has not been made by the department; or
27	(b) has been made by the department but:
28	(i) an administrative appeal under Title 2, chapter 4, can still be filed or has been filed;
29	(i)(ii) a petition for judicial review can still be filed or has been filed; or
30	(iii) an appeal to the Montana supreme court can still be filed or has been filed.

1 (2) This section does not prevent the department from considering more than one application for the

- 2 same location pursuant to competition for a last available license. The department may not approve an application
- 3 for the same license if any appeal as provided in this section may be or has been filed."
