4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA REQUESTING AN INTERIM STUDY TO EXAMINE THE DEPARTMENT OF LIVESTOCK'S LAW
6	ENFORCEMENT DUTIES; AND REQUIRING THAT THE FINAL RESULTS OF THE STUDY BE REPORTED
7	TO THE 66TH LEGISLATURE.
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9	WHEREAS, livestock detectives appointed by the territorial government are thought to be Montana's first
10	law enforcement agency; and
11	WHEREAS, it is the mission of the Montana Department of Livestock to "protect the livestock industry
12	from theft and predatory animals"; and
13	WHEREAS, state law allows the Department of Livestock to employ stock inspectors and detectives "for
14	the protection of the livestock interests of this state"; and
15	WHEREAS, state law allows inspectors and detectives to have law enforcement powers, including the
16	power to arrest a person violating the laws of Montana; and
17	WHEREAS, during 2013, the department's 18 inspectors investigated or filed 98 misdemeanor and 28
18	felony cases for crimes including illegal branding and theft of livestock; and
19	WHEREAS, the Legislature must ensure that the duties of today's livestock inspectors meet the needs
20	of today's livestock industry.

22	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
23	STATE OF MONTANA:
24	That the Legislative Council be requested to designate an appropriate interim committee, pursuant to
25	section 5-5-217, MCA, or direct sufficient staff resources to examine the legal processes related to livestock laws
26	in Montana and the procedures used meant to protect producers.
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the study consider:
28	(1) any relevant reports and analyses;
29	(2) input from the Department of Livestock, the Board of Livestock, the livestock industry, and the general
30	public; and

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1	(3)	procedures and	processes	in	other	states.
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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the study is assigned to staff, any findings or conclusions be presented to and reviewed by an appropriate committee designated by the Legislative Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all aspects of the study, including presentation and review requirements, be concluded prior to September 15, 2018.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final results of the study, including any findings, conclusions, comments, or recommendations of the appropriate committee, be reported to the 66th Legislature.
