4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING IMPORTATION OF ANIMAL CARCASSES FROM

6	EXCEPTIONS; PROVIDING CRIMINAL PENALTIES A PENALTY; AND PROVIDING AN A DELAYED

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Prohibition on carcass imports. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2),
12	it is unlawful to transport into this state the whole carcass or certain carcass parts of white-tailed deer, mule deer,
13	moose, or elk from states or provinces with documented occurrences of chronic wasting disease, as determined
14	by the fish and wildlife commission, in wild populations or on private game farms.
15	(2) The following carcass parts may be transported into this state from the places described in
16	subsection (1):
17	(a) meat that is cut and wrapped or meat that is boned out;
18	(b) quarters or other portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached;
19	(c) hides with no heads attached;
20	(d) skull plates or antlers with no meat or tissue attached;
21	(E) SKULLS THAT HAVE BEEN BOILED AND CLEANED TO REMOVE FLESH AND TISSUE;
22	(e)(F) upper canine teeth; and
23	(f)(G) head, partial body, or whole body mounts prepared by a taxidermist.
24	(3) (a) Except as provided in subsection (3)(b), a A person convicted of a violation of this section shall
25	be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$1,000 UP TO \$500 or be imprisoned in the county detention center for
26	not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person, upon conviction or forfeiture of bond or bail, may be
27	subject to forfeiture of any current hunting, fishing, or trapping license issued by the state and the privilege to
28	hunt, fish, or trap in this state or to use state lands as defined in 77-1-101 for recreational purposes for a period
29	of time set by the court.
30	(b) A person convicted of a second or subsequent violation of this section that occurred within 3 years

of the most recent previous violation is guilty of a felony and shall be fined not more than \$50,000 or be imprisoned in the state prison for not more than 5 years, or both. In addition, the person shall forfeit any current hunting, fishing, or trapping license or permit issued by this state and lose the privilege to hunt, fish, or trap in this state for not less than 3 years up to a revocation for life from the date of conviction.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 87, chapter 6, part 4, and the provisions of Title 87, chapter 6, part 4, apply to [section 1].
