8	WHEREAS, the state has not undertaken significant statewide activities to provide education on the
9	difficult topics of child sexual abuse and child sex trafficking, to provide parents with information on the warning
10	signs of child sexual abuse, or to prevent sexual abuse or sex trafficking of children.
11	
12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
13	
14	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Child sexual abuse SEX TRAFFICKING and child sex trafficking
15	prevention. The department of justice OFFICE OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall IS ENCOURAGED TO undertake activities
16	to educate Montanans about AND PREVENT child sexual abuse SEX TRAFFICKING and child sex trafficking. Activities
17	must MAY include but are not limited to:
18	(1) reviewing best practices for preventing child sexual abuse SEX TRAFFICKING and moving toward
19	<del>implementing the practices in Montana</del> ;
20	(2) providing educational presentations and distributing educational materials to ACCESS TO EDUCATIONAL
21	RESOURCES FOR interested parents, teachers, child-care providers, and other community members on how to
22	prevent child <del>sexual abuse</del> <u>SEX TRAFFICKING</u> <del>and child sex trafficking</del> , on the warning signs of child <del>sexual abuse</del>
23	SEX TRAFFICKING and child sex trafficking, and on predatory behaviors;
24	(3) coordinating educational and prevention efforts with law enforcement, the department of public health
25	and human services, and local organizations that work to prevent child abuse; SEX TRAFFICKING; AND
26	(4) gathering data and maintaining statistics on the levels of child sexual abuse and child sex trafficking
27	in Montana and making these statistics publicly available; SUPPORTING SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN DEVELOPING:
28	(a) POLICIES ON CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE SEX TRAFFICKING AWARENESS, PREVENTION, RESPONSE, AND REPORTING;
29	<u>AND</u>
30	(B) EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS AND CURRICULA AIMED AT PREVENTING CHILD-SEXUAL ABUSE; AND SEX

6	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
7	integral part of Title 44, chapter 4, part 15 TITLE 20, CHAPTER 7, PART 13, and the provisions of Title 44, chapter
8	4, part 15 TITLE 20, CHAPTER 7, PART 13, apply to [section 1].
9	
10	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Termination. [This act] terminates September 30, 2021.
11	
12	COORDINATION SECTION. Section 3. Coordination instruction. If House Bill No. 2 is passed and
13	APPROVED AND DOES NOT INCLUDE FUNDING FOR [THIS ACT], THEN [THIS ACT] IS VOID.
