5	PROVIDING THAT IF A PEACE OFFICER STOPS A MOTORIST AND DISCOVERS THE MOTORIST HAS
6	UNPAID TRAFFIC FINES THE PEACE OFFICER MAY IMPOUND THE VEHICLE; AND AMENDING SECTION
7	61-8-711, MCA."

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	Section 1. Section 61-8-711, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"61-8-711. Violation of chapter penalty. (1) It is a misdemeanor for a person to violate any of the
13	provisions of this chapter unless the violation is declared to be a felony.
14	(2) Each person convicted of a misdemeanor for a violation of any of the provisions of this chapter for
15	which another penalty is not provided shall for a first conviction be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 or more
16	than \$100. For a second conviction within 1 year after the first conviction, the person shall be punished by a fine
17	of not less than \$25 or more than \$200. Upon a third or subsequent conviction within 1 year after the first
18	conviction, the person shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 or more than \$500.
19	(3) Except as provided in subsection (4) subsections (4) and (6), failure to pay a fine imposed under this
20	chapter is a civil contempt of the court. On failure of payment of a fine, the court may:
21	(a) order enforcement of the fine by execution in the manner provided in 25-13-204 and under the
22	provisions of Title 25, chapter 13; or
23	(b) if the court finds that the person is unable to pay, order the person to perform community service.
24	(4) If property is not found in an amount necessary to satisfy the unpaid portion of the fine and if the court
25	makes a written finding that community service is inappropriate, the person shall be imprisoned in the county jail
26	in the county in which the offense was committed, and the imprisonment shall be the number of days that the fine
27	is divisible by the dollar amount of the incarceration credit contained in 46-18-403.
28	(5) Upon conviction, the court costs or any part of the court costs may be assessed against the
29	defendant in the discretion of the court.
30	(6) If a person stopped by a peace officer, as defined in 45-2-101, for a traffic violation under this chapter

1 and the peace officer learns that the person has unpaid fines for violations of this chapter, the peace officer may

- 2 summarily impound the vehicle operated by the person to a place of safety for a period of time not exceeding 60
- 3 days and at a fee of no more than \$10 a day until the unpaid fines are paid."
