4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA EMPHASIZING THE VALUE OF PUBLIC LANDS IN MONTANA TO THE STATE'S ECONOMY
6	RECREATION, HERITAGE, AND QUALITY OF LIFE; AND OPPOSING ANY EFFORT TO CLAIM, TAKE OVER
7	LITIGATE FOR, OR SELL OFF FEDERAL LANDS WITHIN THE STATE OF MONTANA.

9	WHEREAS, Montana has some of the most beautiful landscapes on earth, including mountains, rivers
10	forests, foothills, prairies, sagebrush steppes, and badlands and many of those places are found on federal public
11	lands; and
12	WHEREAS, Montana's wide boundaries include a bountiful collection of the most outstanding public lands
13	and contain the crown of the continent and the incomparable national parks of Glacier and Yellowstone, ou
14	nation's first national park; and
15	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands consist of national parks, wildlife refuges, wilderness areas
16	Indian reservations, national monuments, national forests, historic sites, recreation areas, and wild and scenic
17	rivers, which constitute more than 28% of the land in Montana; and
18	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands are managed for multiple uses including timber, range, water
19	recreation, and wildlife and provide Montanans with opportunities to engage in land management planning; and
20	WHEREAS, access to these federal public lands is essential to the quality of life in Montana, providing
21	all Montanans with world-class opportunities for hunting and angling, hiking, backpacking, snowmobiling, riding
22	all-terrain vehicles, wildlife watching, skiing, cycling, sightseeing, and numerous other recreational activities; and
23	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands are incredibly rich in wildlife, are essential for the preservation
24	of our native fish and wildlife, and provide some of the best hunting and angling opportunities in the world; and
25	WHEREAS, our public lands contain places of cultural and religious significance to Native Americans
26	such as ancestral burial grounds, fishing sites, and lands that supply traditional foods and medicines; and
27	WHEREAS, Montana's federal public lands provide important resources for the timber industry; and
28	WHEREAS, Montana's agricultural industry includes numerous ranchers who depend on grazing federa
29	public lands to sustain their operations; and
30	WHEREAS, Montana's diverse communities rely on clean and reliable sources of water that originate

1	on federal public lands; and
2	WHEREAS, federal public lands contribute significantly to Montana's tourism and outdoor recreation
3	economies, creating jobs and generating important tax revenue throughout the state; and
4	WHEREAS, Montana's outdoor recreation is a major draw to businesses to recruit employees and to
5	establish new businesses; and

WHEREAS, Montanans with diverse interests are actively collaborating with federal land managers to move good forest management projects forward; and

WHEREAS, federal public lands belong to all Americans and reflect many of our country's most noble democratic ideals relating to freedom, equality, and preservation of our natural heritage for our children and future generations.
