FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- 1. HB 366 raises the cap the state will pay towards a crime victim's funeral expenses. Each funeral is not necessarily paid at the full capped amount.
- 2. The Department of Justice does not anticipate an increase in total claims costs due to the increase in the cap.
- 3. However, if a fiscal year had excessive claims beyond the Crime Victim Compensation fund (CVC), federal CVC funds would cover the shortfall.
