Description of fiscal impact: HB 457 seeks to protect personal information of internet customers by requiring prior opt in consent. Whenever the Department of Justice (DOJ) has a reason to believe that a provider has violated a provision, the department may bring an action on behalf of the state against the provider. Actions are currently not certain and therefore, the fiscal impact of this bill is unable to be determined.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Justice (DOJ)

- Section 10 of the bill states that DOJ "may" bring an enforcement action forward. If there were violations discovered, the department may be forced to pursue enforcement actions. Pursuing enforcement actions would require additional resources to investigate civil actions, prepare for pleadings, compile/request discovery documentation, participate in hearings or trials, and hire subject matter experts. If the additional enforcement actions listed above are undertaken, DOJ does not presently have enough staffing and resources.
