- HB 500 prohibits the abortion of an unborn child capable of feeling pain; provides exceptions, definitions, penalties and civil remedies. New Section 4 of this bill creates a new felony crime. New Section 5 of the bill creates a new civil cause.
- 2. The number of district court cases may increase as a result of this legislation; however, the Judicial Branch is unable to estimate the impact on judicial workload or the fiscal impact. The cumulative impact of such legislation may eventually require additional judicial resources because court dockets currently are full in many judicial districts throughout the state.

## Office of Public Defender:

8.	The number of court cases may increase due to a potential increase in clients as a result of this legislation;
	however, the OPD is unable to estimate the fiscal impact on the workload. The cumulative impact of such
	legislation will eventually require additional OPD resources as caseloads are currently exceeding the
	American Bar Association caseload standards.
