<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> HB 710 will require drug manufacturers to report to the Department of Justice (DOJ) price factors for prescription drugs. The increased workload to administer the program and the development of a reporting procedure will require 1.25 FTE in DOJ.

## FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **Assumptions:**

- 1. This bill will require 1.25 FTE to manage technical work including data collection, reporting, compliance, and enforcement.
- 2. A 1.0 FTE Compliance Manager will cost \$94,228 in salary and benefits and \$10,892 in operating costs in FY 2020. Included in the operating costs are one-time only expenses of \$4,400 for new employee set-up.
- 3. A .25 FTE Attorney will cost \$29,508 in salary and benefits and \$10,892 in operating costs in FY 2020. Included in the operating costs are one-time only expenses of \$4,400 for new employee set-up.
