<u>Description of fiscal impact:</u> If passed, the Office of Public Defender expects a significant increase in cases. The bill would also increase the penalty if the perpetrator used or threatened force or the use of a weapon, or if the victim is a minor. Under these circumstances, stalking would be a felony punishable by a fine, imprisonment, or both. This bill would also include convictions in other states or on federally recognized reservations when determining the number of past convictions. The Department of Corrections and the Judicial Branch may also see impacts from this legislation but are unable to determine the specific impacts.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Office of Public Defender (OPD)

- 1. OPD assumes this bill will substantially expand the scope of the stalking and violation of no contact statutes.
- 2. During FY 2018, there were 30 felony cases related to stalking and 256 misdemeanor cases related to no contact and stalking. OPD assumes that if passed, this bill will increase caseload by 60 felony cases and 512 misdemeanor cases.
- 3. In FY 2018, the cost per case was \$1,752 for felony cases and \$365 for misdemeanor cases.
 - a. The total impact per fiscal year is \$292,000.
 - i. Felony case cost increase would be \$105,120 (\$1,752 cost per case x 60 cases).
 - ii. Misdemeanor case cost increase would be \$186,880 (\$365 cost per case x 512 cases).
 - iii. There is a 1.5% inflation factor added to FY 2022 and FY 2023.

Department of Corrections

- 4. The Department of Corrections determined 132 people have been previously prosecuted under Section 45-5-220, MCA. Seventy-six of those prosecuted were sentenced to the Department of Corrections for an average sentence of 54 months. Fifty-six people received an average deferred sentence of 39 months. Of the 76 sentenced to the Department of Corrections, 23 people did not receive any sentence suspension. Forty people received a fully suspended sentence, while the remaining 13 received a partial sentence suspension.
- 5. The Department of Corrections is unable to determine how many new sentences would be prosecuted under the proposed changes.
- 6. If a person is convicted of a felony under this language, the cost of incarceration is \$39,971 per year per male inmate and \$38,675 per year per female inmate.

Judicial Branch

7. The number of district court cases may increase due to this legislation. The Judicial Branch is unable to estimate the impact on judicial workload or the fiscal impact. The cumulative impact of such legislation may eventually require additional judicial resources because court dockets currently are full in many judicial districts throughout the state.
