(1) The Montana arts council shall award grants for projects authorized by and limited to the 13 amounts appropriated by [section 2] and this section. Money must be disbursed in priority order, first to projects 14 covered under subsection (3) and second to projects listed in [section 2]. 15 (2) The Montana arts council shall disburse money to projects authorized by [section 2] through grant 16 contracts between the Montana arts council and the grant recipient. The award contract must bind the parties to 17 conditions, if any, listed with the appropriation in [section 2]. 18 (3) There is appropriated from the cultural and aesthetic projects trust fund account to the Montana 19 historical society \$30,000 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for care and conservation of capitol complex 20 artwork. 21 22 NEW SECTION.
