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10	10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 1. Child protection specie	alist incentive program purpose eligibility.	
11	11 (1) There is a loan reimbursement program for a person who is	employed by the department as a child protection	
12	specialist to provide services in accordance with Title 41, chapter 3. The purpose of the program is to improve		
13	recruitment and retention of individuals who have the skills to work with vulnerable children and families.		
14	(2) The loan assistance program is administered by the department. The program must provide for the		
15	direct repayment of educational loans of eligible child protection specialists in accordance with policies and		
16	procedures adopted by the department.		
17	17 (3) A child protection specialist seeking loan reir	nbursement shall submit an application to the	
18	department. The application must include official verification or proof of the applicant's total unpaid accumulated		
19	educational loan debt and other documentation required by the department as necessary for verification of the		
20	20 applicant's eligibility.	applicant's eligibility.	
21	21 (4) The department may require an applicant to provid	e documentation that the applicant has exhausted	
22	22 repayment assistance from other federal, state, or local loar	repayment assistance from other federal, state, or local loan forgiveness, discharge, or repayment incentive	
23	programs.		
24	(5) A child protection specialist who has completed a bachelor's degree is eligible for reimbursement for		
25	each full, consecutive year of employment as a child protect	each full, consecutive year of employment as a child protection specialist, up to a maximum of 3 years. The	
26	annual loan repayment may not exceed:		
27	(a) \$3,000 after the first full year of employment with the department as a child protection specialist;		
28	(b) \$4,000 after the second full year of consecutive employment with the department as a child protection		
29	specialist; and		
30	(c) \$5,000 after the third full year of consecutive employment with the department as a child protection		
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1	specialist.	
2	(6) The department may remit payment of the loan on behalf of the child protection specialist.	
3	(7) If funding for the loan reimbursement program in any year is less than the total amount for which	
4	eligible child protection specialists qualify, the department shall allocate the available funding to child protection	
5	specialists as specified by rule.	
6	(8) This section may not be construed to require the provision of loan repayment assistance without an	
7	express appropriation for that purpose.

9	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation. (1) There is appropriated \$1 million from the general func	
10	to the department of public health and human services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, for the child	
11	protection specialist incentive program provided for in [section 1].	
12	(2) The legislature intends that the appropriation in this section be considered a part of the ongoing base	
13	for the next legislative session.

15	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an	
16	integral part of Title 52, chapter 2, part 1, and the provisions of Title 52, chapter 2, part 1, apply to [section 1].

18	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2019.
