28	28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Unpaid school meal d	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Unpaid school meal debt required communications. (1) A school	
29	29 district shall direct any communications regarding a student's u	district shall direct any communications regarding a student's unpaid debt for previously served school meals to	
30	30 the student's parent or guardian only. Nothing in this subse-	ction prohibits a school district from sending a	
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1 notification that is addressed to the student's parent or guardian home with student.

(2) When a student's school meal account reaches a negative balance, the school district shall notify the parent or guardian of the student within 10 days of the school meal account reaching the negative balance.

- (3) The school district shall notify the parent or guardian of a student with unpaid school meal debt of the opportunity to apply for free or reduced-priced school meals. During the period the school district is waiting for the parent or guardian to respond to the notification regarding free or reduced-price school meals, the school district may not deny the student access to a school meal.
- (4) Nothing in this section requires a school district to forgive a student's unpaid school meal debt or prohibits a school district from using legal means to collect the debt from the student's parent or guardian.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Unfunded mandate laws superseded. The provisions of [this act] expressly supersede and modify the requirements of 1-2-112 through 1-2-116.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Codification instruction. [Sections 1 and 2] are intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 20, chapter 10, part 2, and the provisions of Title 20, chapter 10, part 2, apply to [sections 1 and 2].
