4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING A HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONSE AND
5	PREPAREDNESS TASK FORCE; ESTABLISHING MEMBERSHIP, DUTIES, AND REPORTING
6	REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE
7	AND A TERMINATION DATE."
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9	WHEREAS, many hazardous material loads are transported on Montana's railways and highways, and
10	rural fire departments have limited capacities to respond to hazardous material spills; and
11	WHEREAS, the State Emergency Response Commission established in 10-3-1204 has developed a
12	hazardous materials response plan reliant on regional hazardous materials response teams for technical
13	assistance, and those teams are not always able to reach remote locations in a timely fashion; and
14	WHEREAS, rural fire departments report that they are unable to respond to hazardous material spills
15	adequately, and there is no plan in place to improve their ability to respond; and
16	WHEREAS, the state would benefit from new and diverse sources of information to offer a unique set
17	of solutions to hazardous materials response challenges that are specific to Montana.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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21	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Hazardous materials response and preparedness task force
22	membership duties reporting. (1) There is a hazardous materials response and preparedness task force
23	administratively attached to the department of transportation.
24	(2) Task force members are appointed as follows:
25	(a) two members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker with the concurrence of the
26	minority leader, one from the majority party and one from the minority party;
27	(b) two senators appointed by the president with the concurrence of the minority leader, one from the
28	majority party and one from the minority party; and
29	(c) 10 members appointed by the governor, none of whom may be a currently serving legislator. These
30	members include:

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1	(i) four representatives from local emergency response organizations, such as law enforcement
2	emergency medical service providers, and hazardous response teams;
3	(ii) two representatives who are also members of a state-recognized or federally recognized Indian tribe
4	located within the boundaries of Montana;
5	(iii) one representative from a county or local government;
6	(iv) one representative from the public service commission;
7	(v) one representative from the railway industry; and
8	(vi) one representative from the trucking industry.
9	(3) The task force shall:
10	(a) examine state railroad inspections to determine if inspections are adequate to address safety issues
11	and prevent derailments;
12	(b) assess any other areas the task force considers necessary to work toward reducing the risk of a rai
13	or roadway accident involving hazardous materials; and
14	(c) offer recommendations that include suggestions to improve responder retention, recruitment, and
15	capacity.
16	(4) The task force shall complete its work and issue a report of its findings and recommendations to the
17	state emergency response commission, the public service commission, and the state administration and veterans
18	affairs interim committee provided for in 5-5-228 by September 15, 2020.
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20	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated \$20,000 from the general fund to the
21	public service commission for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, to convene the task force established in
22	[section 1].
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24	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
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26	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Termination. [This act] terminates December 31, 2020.
